Test Run for Re-Opening Worship This Sunday

We have our plans in place for worship this Sunday. Attendance is capped at 80 and we've reached that number with registrations. You can go to our website and sign up to be on the waiting list or call and see if we've had cancellations and may have a spot or two open.

As mentioned in the special mailing, there will be some protocols to follow. If you're signed up, it's a good idea to get here early to allow plenty of time for check in, etc. We all know the old saying about "the best laid plans..." and expect that there may be a few snags along the way so please be patient (and you may want to bring an umbrella depending on the weather forecast). See page 14 for a reminder.

Also, Sunday morning Bible study will continue online but will be moved to 10:30 a.m. instead of 10:15 a.m. to allow the pastors extra time to finish worship and set up for the Bible study. The planned topic is the Psalms.



The Parish Planning Council is set to meet June 9 to discuss how things went, any changes to make things go smoother and possibly adding more services.

Most important, if you are in a high risk category or just don't feel comfortable about mingling with 80 other people even spread out, the best option is to continue to stay home.

We will still live stream and think we've worked out our sound issues. We're ordering a new camera but it probably won't be here for at least a couple months. You can also call and request DVDs of worship services. Dial-A-Devotion and online devotions will also continue.

Church Properties Board Director, Brad Dahn, has been making progress on researching options for repairing or replacing the car port which was damaged in March. He's working on forming a committee and has set up meetings with some contractors to get ideas and prices to repair or replace the car port and the bell tower. A few years back we talked to an architect about expanding the front lobby but decided not to proceed with the project. This seems like a good time to revisit that idea again. Once we get estimates, they will be submitted for review to the insurance company handling the claim. We're hoping to get the project going and completed yet this summer. Watch for updates!

Call to order Rod Helm. Pastor Neubauer - opened with devotions.

Reading of Minutes from April 14th meeting -- approved as read.

Pastors Reports

Pastors Neubauer - has been calling a few members to check in on them --- they have appreciated the call Bible studies going well –live streamed todays bible study

There was a bit of a hiccup on Sundays live stream —not sure what happened

Will ask stewardship board to Budget for better video system

Pastor Newton --- doing morning and family evening devotions FB and Website. Planning to contact Youth to organize a disc golfing activity. Working on his Master Theology program and Germany class.

Question was asked -- when we do get to resume communion, rather than go to the communion rail, is it possible to form a line, similar to when we receive the ashes on Ash Wednesday, to help in the social distancing issue. Pastor stated that when we did do the small group communion at the beginning of this pandemic, it was held in the social hall and the pastor went to the members that were spaced safely apart. The idea will be considered once we know the restsrictions.

Connie Fondow asked if there was a plan on how to let members know when services resume. Pastor Neubauer said once a decision is made to reopen, members could be contacted through another round of phone calls, website and email.

No date was set for the next meeting but will meet prior to when regular services resume.

Parish Planning Special Council Meeting Minutes—May 12, 2020

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss Re-open Plan.

Present — Present via Google meet — Pam Heeren, Connie Fondow, Elayne Luiken, Jerry Grudem, Brad Dahn, Lori Griess, Pastor Newton, Pastor Neubauer, Brandi Backmann, Mike Poole, Rod Helm, Ginny Ranisate, Shirley Potter. Call to order: Rod Helm, Executive Director. Open devotions — Pastor Neubauer. Minutes from April 28th meeting — approved as read.

Treasurer's Report - Ginny Ranisate

Offering Comparison:

May 3, 2020 12,738 May 5, 2019 8,606 May 10, 2020 13,573 May 12, 2019 8,023 Total 26,311 16,629

Offerings are up for the month compared to last year, but I think the remaining Sundays in May will be less. Many people are mailing in offerings for the whole month. I did not included expenses since not much has been paid out yet.

CNB Checkbook Balance as of 05/12/20: \$121,629 Less Dedicated Accounts - \$19,447 Difference \$102,182

The amount for dedicated accounts is mainly \$16,931 from the car port insurance settlement. I will move it to the dedicated saving account by the end of the month.

Healthy Balance \$44,033 (in LCEF Current Fund)

Kitchen Loan Principal \$35,348

PPP Loan Update

The CNB checking account balance includes all the loan proceeds (\$60,000). I transferred \$30,000 into the account on April 30 as mentioned at the April 28 PPC meeting. On May I, Kathy called and said requirements had changed and we needed to take the entire loan amount within 7 days instead of two months, so I transferred the remaining \$30,000 that day. A question was asked about setting up a separate account for the funds. I checked with Kathy about that. It is not a problem to open an account. The issue comes with documenting who is authorized to withdraw the funds. Typically, they require official minutes stating who is this is. Since the money was already in the checking account and would have to be moved there eventually it did not seem worthwhile to do this.

Here is where we are at so far in using the funds:

PPP Eligible Expenses:

Payroll \$20,721 Health/Ret/Dis. \$6,786 Utilities (Gas, Electric, Phone) \$1,568

Total Expenses \$29,075 (60,000-29,075=30,925 remaining)



You may notice that these figures do not match the April 28 report. As I did more research some expenses I thought were eligible were not.

I've also talked to Kathy about requirements for loan forgiveness/repayment and she said they don't have any solid information — "...this has been a crash course with all of us and sometimes having only an hour to make changes. We do not have the document yet from SBA to figure debt forgiveness. There are lots of samples out there. Some use number of employees, some use dollars spent on employees and some use both. I think on the small businesses we will only see random checks from SBA." It is possible that we may have to pay back some of the loan. I'm not sure that payroll expenses will be as much as they were for April (less services after Easter so less pay to organists is one reason). It's probable that we will not meet the criteria for maintaining the same number of employees which would also result in a reduction in the amount forgiven. We will have to wait and see what the SBA finally decides for requirements.

Funds for Camera

We could pay for the camera from various dedicated accounts-undesignated memorials, Thrivent Choice, etc. We also just received a bequest that was over \$10,000. The only restriction was that it not be used for "budget relief" so that would also be an option.

Pastors Report

Pastor Neubauer reviewed a Re-Opening plan that he and Pastor Newton had put together to be implemented when we can re-open. Plan attached. The PPC commended both pastors for their great work on this detailed plan. Conversation and input from PPC members. Some items discussed but not limited to, sanitizing team, use SignUp Genius for registering for attending a church service as numbers will be limited, taking temperatures, communion distribution options.

Voter's meeting is still scheduled for June 2nd – but subject to change if Governor's Executive Order on limiting the large group meetings has not changed.

Church Properties – Canopy and Bell Tower repair


Brad Dahn reported on the status of the carport canopy. The engineer's report recommendation to replace the canopy. But said that it could be repaired –not recommended. The insurance wants a price for both repair and replace. The engineer also looked at the bell tower and was concerned of the safety – bricks are loose and there cracks throughout. Recommended it needs repair sooner than later. Brad stated that we have known that the structural integrity of the bell tower has been getting worse for some time and says we can't wait any longer. We need to do something with it in the next few months --- not next year. Engineer recommended putting a barrier around it to keep people from getting too close. He also recommended installing a cable to support the carport in case of strong winds. Both the cable and barrier are in place.

Rod Helm contacted an architect out of Perham today. (BHH Architects) Rod asked the PPC for permission to get BHH to inspect the tower and give us a bid for repair. We do not want to repair the canopy until the tower is fixed as the two are connected. Connie Fondow made a motion to approved getting the bid on the belltower. Lori Griess second. Motion carried.

- Popcorn




What you do:

Opened with devotion - Pastor Neubauer - Luke Chapter 12, 25 and 26 - Anxious and worried.

Review opening of Church Services Plans.

Pastor Neubauer asked who saw the survey – about 65% are thinking to return as soon as we reopen. Some comments from the survey follow.

No shaking of hands — no close contact --- avoid crowded hallways. Looking forward to attend live Sound online is an issue. Urge elderly to stay away.

Pastor Neubauer asked each Parish Planning Council member and Elder to give comments on their opinion of opening on June 7 with communion and also a Wednesday evening service. A few of the comments listed below.

Would we have enough people if limited to under 65?

Question whether separate services by age group.

Ushered in and out.

Take Temperatures –

Soft opening – Practice run –

Sunday should be the day – not Wednesday

Does not agree with the mask requirement

Do Pastors know if other churches be opening? And what safety precautions are they taking

Open doors 10 minutes prior to service to prohibit congregating in small areas – possible

Why segregate the age population with separate services

Reopen for mental and spiritual well-being especially for the elderly

Use abundance of caution --- social distancing and if you do not feel well - don't come.

Motion made Lori Griess--- Open church to service June 7th with 80 capacity — sign up the week prior. Jerry Grudem second – carried.

The following info was agreed on regarding change to the initial re-open plan

Ushers will direct traffic

No socializing before and after service in the building-

Suggest socializing on front lawn before or after service

Elders will meet regarding the logistics.

Calls will be made to members regarding the opening

Mask required until you are seated and when you leave

No Wednesday – only Sunday service at 9:00 am – this will be lived streamed as well



Reserve your pew -- Sign up Genius on line or call the church Signs displayed to tell everyone expectations of safety Temperatures will be taken upon entering the church Communion --- communion at the end of service while exiting the sanctuary. Singing will be allowed.

It looks like both income and expenses are up compared to last year. Thanks to online giving and members mailing and bringing in offerings our income has remained rather steady. Two of the main reasons for the increased expenses are that we have used about \$5,000 more of the budget for ABC Preschool since there was no school/tuition and \$2,500 for the kitchen loan. There are other areas where we have not spent as much which is why the difference does not equal \$7,500.

PPP Loan--So far, we have spent approximately \$38,364 of the \$60,000 PPP proceeds. Estimating payroll and eligible expenses, it looks like we will use \$54,420 for payroll expenses and \$2,662 for other eligible expenses for a total of \$57,082. This means that we will probably have to pay back \$2,918.

Everything You Need to Know to Attend Worship—A Reminder

General Worship Information:

- The worship time will stay at 9:00 a.m. Live streaming will continue.
- After the live stream is ended, we will hold the communion service for those present.
- Seating is limited to 80 people. Everyone must sit in their assigned pew.
- We plan to sing. There is quite a bit of dispute over the "science" of singing and virus transmission, so we will be cautious about our singing.
- Hand sanitizers, disposable masks and tissues are available for your use.

So you want to come to church:

- First, consider if it's a good idea. If you are in a high risk group, we encourage you to continue to shelter in place and not risk exposure. If you are not feeling well or have a temperature, please stay home. If you think you may have been exposed or have been tested and are waiting for results, please stay home. If you don't have any issues that require staying home, that's great! Move to the next step.
- Sign up. To make sure we don't go over our 80 person limit, you must sign up. You can call the church office and we will sign you up. You can also go to our website and click the link to sign up online. This will take you to a new page. Scroll down to choose an open pew. Click the "sign up" box. Scroll down to the "Submit and Sign Up" box. Enter your name. You can enter your email address if you would like an email confirmation but it's not required. Check how many people will be attending (I or 2). If there are more than two people in your family, sign up for two and note how many will be attending in the comment section. We know some families will take more space and plan to adjust seating assignments to accommodate them. If you attend worship one Sunday, please wait until the next Friday morning to see about signing up again so everyone has an opportunity to attend.
- Now you're set until Sunday morning.
- On Sunday morning before you head to church, make sure that you (and any other family members) are feeling well and meet the previous criteria. Allow plenty of time to get here and get checked in before the service starts at 9:00 a.m.
- You can park in the front or back lot.
- You are strongly encouraged to wear a mask as you enter the building until you are seated in the sanctuary.
- If there is a line, please remember to stay six feet away from others. Doors will be propped open and an usher will greet you.
- Your name will be checked off on the sign up list.
- Your temperature will be checked with a no-touch forehead thermometer. If it's over 100 degrees, you (and any other family members) will have to go home.
- You will be directed to enter the sanctuary, and someone will help you find your seat.

- If you are dropped off at the front door, you will be asked to enter the sanctuary and wait for your partner in your seat.
- A secure place will be provided to deposit an offering on your way to the sanctuary.
- Bulletins and orders of service will be placed in the pews. These should be taken home or recycled.
 There will be a box available for recycling. Hymnals will not be used.
- Time to worship!
- After the service, the live stream will stop and we will continue with communion. The pastors will wear masks and thoroughly disinfect their hands before distribution.
- Communion will be done pew by pew. Disposable cups will be used. There will be a basket available to dispose of your cup.
- Once you receive communion, please exit the building.
- If you do not wish to receive communion, you can leave the building when your pew is dismissed.
- Anyone who wants to visit should consider the front or back parking lot and remember to practice social distancing.

Other Matters:

- Restrooms
 - * Limit of two people in a bathroom at a time.
 - * Follow the posted signs for proper hand washing.
 - * Use your paper towel to open the door on your way out.
- Drinking fountains will be covered with a "do not use" sign.
- Rooms that are not being used will be locked.
