

#### **Ponderings from the Pew**



2020 sure hasn't gone like anyone expected has it? Overnight we went from a freedom loving, relatively care-free society to being fearful of an unknown illness, human interaction, and contact. Hugs are out, dinner parties are out, birthday parties are out, company is out, gathering is mostly out. Who could have predicted in February where we would be today? It is isolating, and scary.



We even stopped gathering in God's house together. A critical part of nurturing faith, we stopped coming together to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest the word of God as delivered to our hungry souls each Sunday in our sanctuary. We are not accustomed to having our church attendance governed by the state. Having experience this portion of it, I can tell you I'm not interested in experiencing it further. However, we have received a tiny taste of persecution. We've had a glimpse into what it's like to have our lives controlled and found it rather unpalatable.

There is a book in the church library – at least there used to be a hundred years ago when I was a young teen - called, "Tortured for Christ." It is a quick read but packs a powerful punch. It's a true story about a Romanian Pastor who spent years in prison tortured for preaching. It's been a few decades since I read it. I remember wondering if something like that ever happened, would I suffer for my faith, or give it up? Would I stand firm in my belief, or would I deny Christ like Peter under duress? Most of us, I'm guessing, would like to imagine pounding our chests in defiance, and standing up for Christianity, declaring steadfast faith to the end. But would we? These are things I wonder about sometimes.








#### **ABC Preschool News**

It's that special time of year where we look forward to heading back to school. This year things will look and feel differently in some respects. ABC Preschool has always had a somewhat "socially distanced" program with smaller classes and extra space available throughout the church to spread out! We are grateful for the wonderful outdoor spaces that allow for nature based learning. But, there will be some visible changes that will take place in order to help maintain a safe and healthy environment. Class routines from arrival to play to snack to



projects have been adjusted. What hasn't changed is the content we teach and the manner in which all children are loved and cared for. The children still receive a Christian based education through structured and non structured activities. The word of God is taught and modeled every day!!

ABC is licensed as a Rule 3 child care center in Minnesota which means we are allowed to re-open under child care regulations. We know that children learn best through in person instruction - especially very young children. They need to see, hear, touch, smell and sometimes taste what is around them as they learn. We want to help build the important foundations of learning - social, emotional, spiritual, physical and academic - so they succeed as life long learners.

To proceed with our mission, ABC needs your financial and spiritual support. Please keep the school, families and children in your prayers as we teach and train young learners. In the past, St. Johns members have been very generous in providing school supplies to help reduce costs. Again this year, there is a school supply board up at church with tags that list items that are needed. There is also a list online. Back to school supplies this year are more than crayons and glue. Things that we don't normally budget for to ensure health and safety are necessary for a safe return to school. Please carefully read the tag that lists the exact item, amount and size desired. Please don't substitute!! If you cannot find an item, please let Kim know. Please return items to church before Sunday, August 23.

The COVID 19 pandemic has been hard on all people and especially hard on families with young children and their ability to financially afford a private school education. We want to be able to offer financial assistance to help cover tuition and transportation costs. Please consider donating to the scholarship fund so we are able to offer help. If you want to help with the general operations of the program, please make note of it on your donation as scholarship funds are different than operational funds.



With all the changes in place and with guidance from the health and safety boards, we are hoping to welcome children back in early fall.

ABC Open House will be held Thursday, August 20 from 10:00 a.m.—1:00 p.m. and 5:00—7:00 p.m. Come in to meet the staff, check out the classrooms and register.
