COVID Update

The predictions were correct that COVID was going to hit our area this fall. As the number of cases surge, our thoughts and prayers go out to those who are dealing with the virus and to the loved ones of those who have passed away. We pray for patience to deal with the restrictions and changes to our routines and activities. We pray that a vaccine will become available and that the virus will be stopped from continuing its spread.



What does the rise in cases mean for St. Johns? The Parish Planning Council met on October 27 and discussed this. Possibilities ranged from closing the church for the month of November, going to one service, returning to signing up for worship, or continuing as we have been and adjusting as the situation changes. At this time, we plan to continue with worship, Sunday School, Bible studies, etc. If this changes, we will send a notice through our various communication channels (postcards, emails, Facebook, phone calls, etc.)


Generous Response to Gift Card Collection for Cedar Rapids, Iowa

The Carport is Gone and the Bell Tower Has a New Look

If you've driven by lately, you've probably noticed the drastic change in our front entrance. Back in August the Voters Assembly approved a new stucco finish for the bell tower. Due to the shape of the tower and freezing/thawing cycles, the brick was flaking off. The interior of the tower is structurally sound. The stucco serves two purposes. It sealed the bricks which will stop the flaking and also improved the tower's appearance. Our stucco expert, Jack Ellefson, spent the past couple months assembling scaffolding, climbing up and down on the scaffold, mixing and plastering while working around the carport and the weather conditions. It was worth it as the bell tower looks wonderful!

The insurance company decided that it would be more cost effective to replace the carport and canopy instead of trying to repair it. The carport was removed on October 23 so we weren't facing the possibility of a collapse this winter with the wind and snow. The plan is to start the replacement project in the spring.

As long as we are replacing the carport, the idea of expanding the front lobby has been brought up. The carport committee asked the designer who did the original carport plans to work up some renderings showing what an expansion would look like. A couple of the drawings are included below. Haataja Construction also gave us a rough cost estimate for the project. This will be one of the agenda discussion items at the Voters Meeting on November 24. Your input is welcome!





Sunday School Update

Currently average about 25-28 kids per week. Would really like to have more input from parents. Sunday School Christmas Service will be December 20th during the 2nd service. We are in need of new costumes, so would appreciate any donations of material that would be appropriate for shepherds, sheep, angels, and wise men. Discussed having an Advent Party for the kids to encourage attendance. Advent begins November 29th. Discussed options if there is another shut down per the state. They were: Closing Sunday School, Continuing classes with the parents having the option of sending kids, or class information being mailed to them, Splitting the music time, so not all children are in the sanctuary at the same time. We are really hoping that this does not happen but, would like to be proactive in case it does.

Release Time

Currently there is no release time. We are hoping that it will resume once there is a reduction in the Covid cases. Pastor discussed the possibility having a four week class for the 3rd grade students and their parents and they would then receive their bibles at the end of this class.

Confirmation

Confirmation will be October 25th for the young adults who should have been confirmed last spring. Classes will begin on November 11th. November 4th is training for the acolytes and parent meeting. Confirmation is set for the 3rd Sunday in May of 2021.

Pre School

29 kids are attending. We have I opening in the 3 year old class and 2 openings in the 4 year old class. If schools are once again closed, preschool will close also. Tuition will be adjusted accordingly.

Mary is doing very well as the new assistant. We are trying new cleaning products to sanitize the classrooms. Discussed raise in salary for Kim to commensurate to the increase for the regular staff. This was based on a discussion by the preschool committee. The amount requested was 1200.00. The raise works out to about 4.00 per session or 3.5%. Motion was made and seconded and passed. This raise is scheduled to take in effect in January 2021.

Discussed the budget for the upcoming year. With, the exception of the preschool budget, we left all other areas at the same rate as last year. The preschool budget was increased from 16,500 to 19,500.

Next meeting will be November 3 at 6:00.

Elders: no report.

Parish Fellowship: Confirmand meal will be Wednesday, October 21 at 5:15 p.m. The seven confirmands, their parents with two

other guests each, and the elders will attend.

Tables will be spaced out for safe distancing.

Menu: Pizza, dessert pizzas, and ice cream bars.

"Cookies and Carols" - At Pastor Neubauer's request, he would like to still hold a form of the event. We're not sure yet how we will safely do this. Details will be forthcoming.

Decorating the church for Christmas will take place on Monday, November 30 starting at 9:00 a.m. Once again, we will try and make this a safe event, keeping everyone at a safe distance from each other, with everyone wearing masks.
