Voters Approve Canopy/Lobby Expansion

The voters approved plans to expand the front lobby in conjunction with replacing the car port which was damaged in March. Here's the approved motion: The voters of St Johns approve the recommendation to use the money from the insurance company (approximately \$49,000) to replace the damaged (and now removed) canopy and provide additional funding (approximately \$133,000) to add a 19 x 36 addition to the entryway as shown on drawings provided by Eric Smith and in conjunction with proposal from HAATAJA Construction dated 9/24/2020. The exact financing for this project is to be coordinated by the PPC.

These detailed drawings from architectural designer, Eric Smith, gave the voters an idea of how the expansion would look. Watch for updates in the coming months. The full minutes from the meeting will be published in next month's newsletter.


Running Out of Things to Do? Make a Prayer Shawl



PASTORS' REPORTS

Pastor Newton highlighted things that he has been doing lately. Including, youth hayride, scavenger hunt, pumpkin carving, confirmation testing, video devotions on YouTube, updating on his Grad School status, as well as normal pastoral duties.

Pastor Neubauer – Confirmation of 7 students last Sunday, they were a good class. Decided to move confirmation back to May 2021 as the first 6 weeks of school in the fall is quite busy for high school students. Confirmation starts November 11th with a parent meeting on November 4th. Pastor Neubauer will be lead teacher with Pastor Newton assisting. Seventh and eighth graders will study the Lord's Prayer and 10 commandments.

A lot of time was been spent on updating technology for better quality Facebook live stream. A new camera was purchased and arrived a couple weeks ago. We are looking for volunteers to run the camera which is extremely easy to learn. Still working on sound of organ and congregational singing when watching live stream service.

BOARD REPORTS

Christian Education - Lori Griess

Sunday School

- Currently average about 25-28 kids per week. Would really like to have more input from parents.
- Sunday School Christmas Service will be December 20th during the 2nd service. We are in need of new costumes, so would appreciate any donations of material that would be appropriate for shepherds, sheep, angels, and wise men.
- Discussed having an Advent Party for the kids to encourage attendance. Advent begins November 29th.
- Discussed options if there is another shut down per the state. Closing Sunday School or continuing classes with the parents having the option of sending kids, or class information being mailed to them. Splitting the music time, so not all children are in the sanctuary at the same time. We are really hoping that this does not happen but, would like to be proactive in case it does.

Release Time

• Currently there is no release time. We are hoping that it will resume once there is a reduction in the Cov-id cases. Pastor discussed the possibility having a four-week class for the 3rd grade students and their parents and they would then receive their bibles at the end of this class.

Confirmation

- Confirmation was October 25th for the young adults who should have been confirmed last spring.
- Classes will begin on November 11th.
- November 4th is training for the acolytes and parent meeting. Confirmation is set for the 3rd Sunday in May 2021.

Pre School

- Twenty-nine (29) kids are attending. We have I opening in the 3-year-old class and 2 openings in the 4-year-old class.
- If schools are once again closed, preschool will close also. Tuition will be adjusted accordingly.
- Mary Harvala is doing very well as the new assistant.
- Discussed a raise in salary for Kim to correspond with the increase for the regular staff. This was based on a discussion by the preschool committee. The amount requested was \$1200.00. The raise works out to about 4.00 per session or 3.5%. Motion was made and seconded and passed. This raise is scheduled to take in effect in January 2021.

Discussed the budget for the upcoming year. With, the exception of the preschool budget, we left all other areas at the same rate as last year. The preschool budget was increased from \$16,500 to \$19,500.

- On Wednesday, October 21, our board served pizza and ice cream to the confirmands, their
 parents and family members, and the elders before students were given their final questioning.
- Our board is planning to organize decorating the church for Christmas on Monday, November 30.

Youth – Brandi Backmann –no report

Church Properties - Brad Dahn

- The Bell Tower has recently been completed and looks great! It was done right on a budget of \$15,500 and none of the contingency money was needed. Jack Ellefson was great to work with, and we were able to work through the problems that arose as they came up, with great success. The committee met several times and made many decisions on the project, thanks to them!
- We received total payments from the insurance company on the canopy of \$48,872.67. So far, we have expenses of \$3,112.58 for engineer's report, drawings and temp bracing, for a balance of \$45,760.09. We have not received a bill for canopy removal at this time, soon I expect. We will be able to use the remainder of money on the project as we desire.
- We are having some drawings done and a structural engineer look at the entryway/canopy addition, so we can come up with some accurate cost estimates to make some very important decisions. So far it has been very ballpark type info we have gotten on the project. Eric Haataja Construction has been working with us to get this all accomplished, and do the work come spring. There will be some work done in the near future on the old canopy roof edge to make it look a little better and keep



water from running off.

A 2021 budget was completed and given to Ginny.

Evangelism – Connie Fondow

- Pastor Knaack is in the process of delivering the gift bags that the board created for those unable to attend (shut ins). Ginny assisted with this task, as well, by giving bags to relatives to pass along to those that Pastor is unable to reach.
- The gift card donation project for King of Kings in Cedar Rapids, Iowa went very well. The value of the gift cards along with monetary donations totaled slightly over \$2,200.00.
- The board will coordinate St. Johns' participation in the Toys for Girls and Boys and Tiny Tots community program for Christmas.
- We will attempt to secure mentors for the new confirmation class which will begin next month.
- The board continues to wait for the opportunity to coordinate and safely host a Trivia event in 2021.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

- Canopy Update: Brad Dahn is working with structural engineer, contractor, and draftsman to get information regarding plans for completing the canopy/entry project. He would like to present a proposal to the voters in November including quotes, drawings of the exterior and interior plans and what the options are for the voters
- **2021 Budget:** Reviewed the proposed 2021 budget. Jerry Grudem will review elders portion and get back to Ginny soon
- Voters Meeting: November 24, 2020 7:00 pm in the sanctuary. The meeting will be live streamed
- Circuit Forum: Lay delegate representative for the Circuit Forum needed for— November 8th 7 pm at St. Johns. Connie Fondow volunteered to be Lay Delegate. Pastor Newton is the Pastoral Representative.
- Pastor Neubauer asked the council for feedback regarding Covid and going forward with worship services. Discussion.
