November 24, 2020

Roll Call of Voting Members -- 17 in person --- 21 online. Eight (8) confirmation students in attendance.

Signing of the Constitution and Bylaws by New voting Members

Approval of the Minutes of August 18, 2020 Voters meeting. - Motion by Larry Hetrick to accept minutes as printed in newsletter, second, Mike Poole. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report - Ginny Ranisate

Our income so far this year is \$380,544 and expenses are \$395,708 with expenses exceeding income by \$15,164. Last year at this time our income was \$387,422 and our expenses were \$398,494 with expenses exceeding income by \$11,072.

The PPP loan forgiveness application has been submitted. Per Kathy Henry at Citizens, all applications are being approved. If our application is approved as expected this would increase our income by \$60,000.

- The new 7th grade confirmation class consists of 3 boys and 3 girls. We are in need of mentors ASAP. Only one male mentor has been secured. Please contact Ginny, one of the pastors, or me if you would consider becoming a mentor to one of these students.
- Trivia in 2021 is a definite possibility. The planning will begin as soon as the COVID situation is abated and it appears safe to proceed with this event. (Hint: While you are resting at home this next month, be sure to watch "It's A Wonderful Life".)

Education – Lori Griess

(Lori was not present – Rod read her prepared report)

Sunday School

- Currently average about 25-28 kids per week. Would really like to have more input from parents.
- Sunday School Christmas Service will be December 20th during the 2nd service. We are in need of new costumes, so would appreciate any donations of material that would be appropriate for shepherds, sheep, angels, and wise men.
 - Discussed having an Advent Party for the kids to encourage attendance. Advent begins November 29th.
 - Discussed options if there is another shut down per the state.
 - Closing Sunday School or continuing classes with the parents having the option of sending kids, or class information being mailed to them.
 - Splitting the music time, so not all children are in the sanctuary at the same time.
 - We are really hoping that this does not happen but, would like to be proactive in case it does.

Release Time

Currently there is no release time. We are hoping that it will resume once there is a reduction in the Covid cases. Pastor discussed the possibility having a four-week class for the 3rd grade students and their parents and they would then receive their bibles at the end of this class.

Confirmation

- Confirmation was October 25th for the young adults who should have been confirmed last spring.
- Classes will begin on November 11th.
- November 4th is training for the acolytes and parent meeting. Confirmation is set for the 3rd Sunday in May 2021.

Pre School

Thirty (30) kids are attending. We have 2 openings in the 4-year-old class.

- If schools are once again closed, preschool will close also. Tuition will be adjusted accordingly.
- Mary Harvala is doing very well as the new assistant.

Discussed a raise in salary for Kim to correspond with the increase for the regular staff. This was based on a discussion by the preschool committee. The amount requested was \$1200.00. The raise works out to about \$4.00 per session or 3.5%. Motion was made and seconded and passed. This raise is scheduled to take in effect in January 2021.

Discussed the budget for the upcoming year. With, the exception of the preschool budget, we left all other areas at the same rate as last year. The preschool budget was increased from \$16,500 to \$19,500.



Youth

COVID Projects

<u>Youth:</u> Figuring how best to minister to our young people when face to face interaction is what they tend to need most and is also what's most dangerous right now; planning (after restrictions are lightened) to break up events more into smaller groups to help alleviate that and to put more focus on specific age groups.

<u>Daily Devotions</u>: We quit recording our evening devotions for a while because George was getting to be too much of a hambone, but he's getting better about devotions again, so we're considering doing that once in a while again. But there is a devotion for each day of the week except Sunday. Monday and Thursday is video devotion; Tuesday is lunch time devotion with Sarah, George, and Norah; Wednesday is a longer Bible study option, which is done by an excellent teacher Dr. Reek (a favorite teacher from Concordia in Seward, NE); Friday and Saturday is a short textual devotion. If you have any feedback on what you would like more or less of, or something else to try, feel free to let me know.

Graduate School

I am finishing up two classes this semester: Culture and Communication, and Idea of the Modern. I'll have one more class in the Spring semester: Theology after the Death of God (God's not actually dead, obviously, but the class intends to study how to live and witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ in a world full of people who believe that he is dead); then I'll have a comprehensive exam to study for and take, and that'll be that. - C. District Convention Delegate <u>Motion Larry Hetrick to nominate Roger Just as District Convention delegate for 2021, second Jerry Grudem motion carried</u>. Mike Poole volunteered--<u>Jody Yliniemi made motion to nominate Mike Poole as District Convention delegate for 2021, second Jerry Grudem, motion carried</u>
- D. Update authorized signers of various church accounts. <u>Motion by Jerry Grudem to name authorized signatures</u> for financial accounts to be Chairman, Vice Chairman and Treasurer currently held by Rodney Helm, Michael Poole and Virginia Ranisate respectively. The authorized signatures would change when new persons were appointed to above named positions. second Jody Yliniemi, motion carried.

- E. Pastor Parsonage Allowances RESOLVED, that St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, as a standing resolution to remain in force and effect until such time as amended or revoked, hereby authorizes and establishes a parsonage allowance for Pastor Neubauer in the amount of \$24,000 and for Pastor Newton in the amount of \$25,500 per year. Motion by Larry Hetrick to accept resolution above, second Jody Yliniemi, motion carried. (this resolution is for tax proposes and does not increase the salary or budget).
- F. Larry Hetrick suggested cancelling the auto insurance for bus as it is not being used due to Covid, Ginny will check with insurance company on this.
- G. Carport/Canopy Update Jerry Grudem went through a Power Point presentation of the project.

History

- We had a truck taller than 8 foot 0 inches unsuccessfully try to drive under the driveway canopy.
- The insurance company offered us about \$17,000 to rebuild the canopy.
- Brad Dahn, as Board of Church Properties director, had an engineer review the structure and concluded that replacement rather than rebuilding would end up safer.
- Brad then tried to get competitive estimates from several general contractors.
- The first proposal came in above \$80,000.
- Two other contractors first indicated interest then decided not to bid the project.
- A project team was put together to help Brad evaluate replacing the canopy.
- While considering the canopy replacement, the building committee thought it would be an opportune time to consider a lobby expansion.
- Brad was then given the name of Eric Haataja of Haataja Construction.
- Eric Haataja helped Brad work through the details of rebuilding the canopy and provided an estimate of \$49,000 which convinced the insurance company increase the insurance money.
- Eric Haataja also then put Brad in touch with Eric Smith an architectural designer.
- Eric Smith was hired by St Johns to draw up a set of plans so Eric Haataja could get competitive pricing from subcontractors. Proposals included electrical work from Marchell Electric and Samuelson Laney Mechanical.
- Eric Smith also made drawings so St Johns could make decisions on how to finish the bell tower with borders and crosses. (turned out great)
- At this point the project team has decided that the price from Haataja Construction would work for a starting
 point for a decision from St Johns voters. Final design input from a structural engineer to size structural
 components for the canopy and addition will give adequate information to Eric Smith to make a working
 drawing set.
- Mechanical and electrical drawings will be provided by those subcontractors.
- The project team recommends that the Voters approve the construction of the entry addition at the same time as the canopy replacement is done to optimize coordination and cost.

Motion by Jerry Grudem member of the special building committee on canopy replacement project.

The voters of St Johns approve the recommendation to use the money from the insurance company (approximately \$49,000) to replace the damaged (and now removed) canopy and provide additional funding (approximately \$133,000) to add a 19×36 addition to the entryway as shown on drawings provided by Eric Smith and in conjunction with proposal from Haataja Construction dated 9/24/2020. The exact financing for this project is to be coordinated by the Parish Planning Council.


