This means the front entry will be closed. We ask that you please use the east entrance or park in the back lot and use the back door during the construction.

COVID Questions

With the latest easing of restrictions by Governor Walz and more people receiving vaccines, we've been asked questions regarding worship and activities at St. Johns. Here's some of the most common ones and current answers. Of course, things are always subject to change quickly as we've discovered over the past year.

- Q: The State says there are no occupancy limits for churches. Why are we still limiting seating at worship services?
- A: Although the state says "no occupancy limits" they're also saying social distancing of six feet is still required. Back when restrictions first went into place we measured the spacing in the pews and the current seating arrangements are based on the six foot distancing. So even though our total occupancy could be up to 400 (if everyone was packed in the pews like sardines) 80 is still our limit to maintain social distancing. If guidelines are reduced to three feet, we will revisit the seating plan.
- Q: I've heard from other people that at their church they can remove masks once they are seated in the pew. Can we do this, too?
 The CDC is still saying everyone should wear a mask so we plan to continue the policy until their guidelines change.
- Q: When can we use the hymnals again?
- A: We're planning to bring back the hymnals at worship services on April 11. They will be on a cart and worshippers will pick them up on the way into church, then return them to the cart following the service. There will be a separate cart for each service. The decision was made to use carts instead of placing hymnals in the pew racks because currently we spray the pews with a disinfectant mist between services which could damage the hymnals.

Since we are returning to hymnal use we will discontinue the printed order of service and replace it with the readings insert we used to have. The order of service will not be posted on the website anymore either. Pastor Neubauer did a survey and only three people responded that they use them.

- Q: What about the noon communion service?
- A: At this time we plan to continue the Wednesday noon communion services through April and then re-assess depending on attendance.

If you have any questions or concerns about COVID policies at the church, please talk to one of the pastors. We hope and pray that you all stay healthy and safe!

The Evening Guild will meet Tuesday, April 13 at 3:00 p.m. Pastor Newton will present the topic.








A New Face in the Office

As for religious support on the base, we are actually doing quite well given our continued COVID prevention and mitigation measures. We are still able to offer a full range of worship services to our trainee population. We might be a little more distanced than previously, but our soldiers have adjusted nicely. Since most of them were never here before the pandemic became ever-present, what we are doing now is normal to them.

We are well stocked with Christian resources at this installation. It is nothing like being deployed and scrambling to find what you need for worship services and devotions. I certainly appreciate you asking. If some need arises which appropriate for the congregation to help with, I will most definitely let you know.

I am still actively engaged with the traditional Christian worship service on the base. In the past few weeks I have received a growing number of requests for individual communion. Since there is not a regularly scheduled Lutheran worship service on the base, I adjust accordingly so I may provide individual Word and Sacrament ministry to those Soldiers who are requesting it. It almost reminds me of being back in the parish and doing home visits. That has been a refreshing addition to more normal weekly routine.

We are hopeful to have a robust Easter Morning Worship Service in just a few more weeks. I think we are better equipped to conduct this festival service this year than we were last year, as we were all trying to frantically respond to the changing guidance about social gatherings. By the grace of God, we should be able to gather in a responsible manner to celebrate the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers as we strive to fulfill our calling to provide Christ centered religious support to our young soldiers as they prepare to serve God and country.


