

Church is a privilege we fail to appreciate; a place where we gather with each other, share our heartaches and joys, receive the gifts God lays on us, and renew ourselves for the day to day of life. Easter Breakfast Roll Recipe

We received lots of compliments on the caramel and cinnamon rolls the youth made for Easter breakfast. Brandi Backmann was the head chef and based her rolls on this recipe from her mom, Lori Griess. Lori received the recipe from Sandy Rowland who got it from her mom, Ethel Hughes Massie.

Caramel Rolls

I c. milk
I ½ c. lukewarm water
2 pkg. yeast
½ c. sugar
4 tsp. salt
2 eggs
I/4 c. shortening
8 c. flour



Scald milk. Melt shortening in milk and let cool. Crumble yeast in warm water and let set for about 10 minutes until foamy. Put sugar, salt, egg, and cooled milk mixture in bowl of a stand mixer. Add 2 cups of flour, mixing well. Add water/yeast mixture and gradually add the rest of the flour. Mix well to achieve a soft dough. (If you are using a stand mixer, mix with a dough hook for about 8 minutes.)

Allow dough to rise until double. Punch down. Divide in half. Roll each half into a rectangle, spread with butter and then sprinkle with a mixture of sugar and cinnamon. Roll and slice into 1 inch pieces. Place in buttered 9 x 13 pan for cinnamon rolls or in a 9x13 pan with prepared caramel mixture on bottom. Allow to rise until almost the top of the pan. Bake in 350° oven for 20-25 minutes.

Caramel mixture: For each pan melt together 6 tbsp. butter, I/4 cup white karo syrup, I cup brown sugar, and I/3 cup cream.

So, it would be my conclusion that the majority of the committee agreed with the building committee request.
