

Guest Speaker from Lutheran Bible Translators Here October 3 Also

On Sunday, October 3 we will have Rev. David Federwitz from Lutheran Bible Translators as our guest preacher. He will also tell us more about LBT during Bible study time.

Rev. David and Valerie Federwitz have been serving in Africa since 2003. They worked in Ghana with Komba-speaking people to develop a Komba language primer series. While David continues to encourage and support the Komba Literacy and Bible Translation Project, he is now LBT's Regional Director for Liberia, Sierra Leone, Ghana, Nigeria, and Cameroon. He spends time with current and potential partner organization leaders in these countries and supervises the LBT missionaries who work in these countries, encouraging and advising them as they serve in their various locations and capacities.

Valerie manages their household, communicates with family and supporters, and is studying to be a Certified Nutrition Therapy Practitioner with the goal of helping her family and missionary colleagues maximize their health through balanced nutrition.

Chaplain Bain is Going Back to School

Here's our latest update from Chaplain Bain:

I am presently serving in an educational setting. I am now assigned to the United States Army - Student Detachment. I have been selected from amongst my peers in the chaplain corps to pursue a Master Degree in Bioethics. Following success full completion of this degree program, I am projected to serve on the chaplain staff at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, as staff bioethicist.



For this present academic year, August 2021 through June 2022, I am a student at the Harvard Medical School - Center for Bioethics. This particular area of Harvard is located close to Fenway Park, in the southern side of Boston, and not on the main campus in Cambridge.

I am both humbled and honored to have the opportunity to prepare for my future assignment at this world class university. It is an amazing experience, and the busiest I have ever been while serving as a military chaplain. The course work is engaging with a robust amount of regular home work, papers, and projects. I will be well prepared for what lies ahead. I am also the first Army chaplain who has been in this program, which is quite interesting on its own. While my focus has shifted from direct soldier care this year, a fair number of my classmates have a approached me to discuss church, religious, and spiritual matters. Always be prepared to give a reason for the hope that you!

We, Paulette and I, have never been to the Boston area. We are finding it to be quite nice. In many ways, it is like northern MN, except the trees are mostly maples and not pines. We were fortunate to secure housing at the Hanscom Air Force Base in Bedford, MA. It's about 1.5 hour commute from the base to school using public transportation. I have been able to use that traveling time for reading, which has been a great help.

The base is located between Lexington and Concord, MA, right in the heart of the earliest Revolutionary War engagements. Just outside the from gate is the location where Paul Revere was captured on his ride to notify the Minute Men of the British troop movements. We have been able to visit some of these incredible historic sites on the weekends.

One of the greatest blessings of this assignment, has been the LCMS congregation in Bedford, MA, where we are worshipping. It's only five miles from the base! We haven't been this close to church in years. It's made it possible for us to regularly participate in worship, bible studies, and choir on a weekly basis. Thanks be to God!

That is quick update as to where we are and what we are doing this year. it is quit the unique military ministry experience.


