Ponderings from the Pew



The holidays are over. Thank God! We have even gotten past the horrible questions – "Any big holiday plans?" "How was your Christmas?" "Did you have a good holiday?" UGH. Can you hear the screaming or is that just in my head? People look at you funny when your response to the first question is, "Surviving." But it's an honest answer. It was an honest answer last year, and the year before. It will be the same answer next year, the year after, and every year until God calls me home. Grief does not get better. Grief does not go away

with time. Love doesn't end. The saying might be cheesy, but grief is love with no place to go. Grief comes and goes like the waves with the tide. The passage of time might make most of the waves less severe, but they don't stop.

I can almost step outside myself to watch the tide coming in. It begins the end of August in the days leading up to the day Caleb died. The day itself is not as bad as the days before when I feel the anxiety ramping up. I'm aware my emotions begin rolling up and down like a super-size roller coaster. October maintains until the day we lost my brother, and then along comes deer hunting – the most wonderful time of the year for them both. They should be out there. We roll right out of that into Thanksgiving. I am grateful, and I know I am blessed. Grandkids are little life preservers. They bring joy back in the mix. The table isn't even cleared when Christmas music begins, the holiday questions start, the decorations come out, the to-do list explodes, the store shelves scream to grab your attention, and we mark my dad's passing not three months past Caleb's. By now, I have built a nice wall around myself, and my blinders are firmly in place trying to just get through it all. Inside, I am frantically picking up pieces of myself, and wishing desperately that I could just go to sleep until January first. The one moment I cling to is singing "Silent Night" in candlelight at the Christmas Eve service. The phrase I despise the most – "It's the most wonderful time of the year..." No, it is truly not. It is not wonderful for us, and I'm sure it isn't for a lot of people. Society insists that we must have holiday plans, sprinkled with glitter, decorated with canned snow, gum drops and icing. We must feel the joy of the season because that's what we do right?

It all feels more like a terrible storm to me. I get through by keeping my head down, putting one foot in front of the other, forging ahead into the freezing sleet and overwhelming wind gusts. What we need to remember in times like this is that we have a Savior Who can calm any storm in life. We are children of the Most High, the Holy One, the Prince of Peace. In the storm on the Sea of Galilee, Jesus revealed His power by speaking to the waves, "Peace! Be Still" (Mark 4:39). "And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm." The disciples wondered, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey Him?" We know. We know Who Jesus is. We have been brought up knowing Him. How blessed are we?

We all have our storms. We all face our challenges in this life. But thank God – He fights with us and for us. Without Him, no one can stand. He is our anchor sure. "Blessed be the Lord, Who daily bears us up; God is our salvation," (Psalm 68:19).

Here's a Few Offering Pointers

St. Johns is a generous congregation and the bulk of our contributions come through the offerings given at worship services. Here are a few tips to remember when you're preparing your offering that will make things easier for you and for our offering counters:

- I. Please use your offering envelopes if you have them. It makes it much easier for the offering counters if they don't have to look up your envelope number. If you haven't picked up your envelopes, stop by the church office and we'll get them for you.
- 2. For special offerings, please make out your check to St. Johns. We can't deposit checks made out to other organizations (like the Food Shelf, Pregnancy Resource Center, etc.). These checks will be sent directly to the organization.
- 3. You don't have to put a separate check or cash in each weekly offering envelope if you are giving monthly or twice a month. You can write one check and use one envelope for the month.
- 4. If you really want to be nice to the counters, don't fold your cash or check. Just slip it right into the envelope.
- 5. Consider automatic offerings. You can set up an automatic withdrawal from your account to St. Johns. You decide the amount and frequency. It's easy to set up and there's no extra charge to you. Stop by and see Ginny Ranisate if you're interested. You can also give online at our website www.stjohnspr.org or with your phone. Check out the article to the left about the phone app.
- 6. If you're good with numbers, detail oriented and available one Sunday a month, consider becoming an offering counter. We usually have teams of two counters and it takes about an hour to count.

 Once again, stop by and see Ginny or give her a call at 732-9783 if you're interested.






The heart of a friend






Trivia Returns Next Month
