# Responding to Those in Need

"So, then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." Galatians 6:10

In late September Good Shepherd Lutheran School in North Fort Myers was one of the many buildings in southwest Florida that suffered extensive structural damage due to the impact of Hurricane Ian. The school enrolls students from early childhood through grade 12. It services many students from diverse backgrounds living in households with financial difficulties and a wide range of other challenges. Rev. Robert Davis, pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and School, states, "For many of these children, we are the only voice of Christ in their lives."

The cafeteria roof was destroyed by the storm. Several classrooms had roof damage as well. The church and school campus experienced significant water damage. Fencing was destroyed, and damage to the playground, bleachers and numerous trees was significant. Dealing with insurance companies, finding contractors, obtaining permits, locating materials and supplies – all of these have added to the stress of the situation at hand. Here's some photos we received from Pastor Davis.

How can St. Johns congregation come together with a compassionate response to the needs of our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ at Good Shepherd? The school is in immediate need of some items that our financial support may enable them to purchase. A few of these replacement items include educational area rugs for the preschool, window mount air conditioners, bookshelves, and outdoor play items.



Following both services on November 6 the congregation will be updated on the situation at Good Shepherd. An opportunity will then be available for members who wish to lend their financial assistance. The Sunday School offerings for 2022-2023 will be sent to the school for purchasing classroom supplies lost in the storm. The annual December basket silent auction proceeds could possibly assist Good Shepherd with the finances needed for one of their window unit air conditioners. We will also plan to send the donations generated at our spring Trivia event to the school.

As you contemplate your own response to this opportunity for "living generously," bear in mind that generosity does not exclusively refer to financial support. Continued prayer can be a generous response to someone's suffering and daily needs. That means that ALL of us have been given the opportunity to, in some way, lovingly respond to the needs of the children at Good Shepherd Lutheran School.



# **Special Voters Meeting Minutes October 16, 2022**

Dr. Helm called the meeting to order. Pastor Neubauer opened with prayer. Motion made, seconded and carried to accept the following as voting members: Kathy Henry, Cheryl Hilgemann, and Jim Sieving. Motion made, seconded and carried to reinstate the following as voting members: Pastor Don Fondow, Jane Hughes, Matt Kaufenberg, Terry Kimball and Renae Olson. There were 45 voters present including the new and reinstated voting members.

Call Committee Chair, Matt Kaufenberg, presented the results of the call survey and the process so far. He introduced the call committee members, which was composed of a good cross section of the membership. The group had some great discussions at their meetings. Following his presentation he made a motion that St. Johns put forth a call to add a pastor. Second by Martin Steffel. Jim Sieving asked if we would call a seminary candidate or from the field. Dr. Helm said that question would be addressed once we decide whether or not to call a second pastor. No further discussion. Motion carried.

Next Matt shared that the overwhelming choice from the surveys was to call a seminary candidate. He made a motion that St. Johns request a candidate from the seminary. Second by Russ Brown. Jerry Grudem asked about the time line. The process for a seminary candidate would be to submit the call in January/February. If we chose to call a pastor from the field, we could start that process right away. Dr. Helm said we would know in April if we would receive a candidate. We wouldn't have a definite date for how long it would take if calling from the field.

Pastor Fondow gave an overview of the process for calling a seminary candidate. We would need to submit our congregation profile to the District President as soon as possible. The placement committee begins their process in December. Renae Olson asked if we could call a candidate and also call a pastor from the field? Pastor Fondow said technically we could but it's not a good practice to request a seminary candidate and then decide not to take them. Pastor Neubauer said that if we don't receive a candidate then we could try calling from the field. Jerry Eischens asked when we would know about the seminary candidate assignments? This happens at the end of April. Doug Kingsley asked about the shortage of candidates to call requests. Pastor Fondow and Pastor Harvala estimated there will be about 80 graduates to fill 100 requests. Matt asked if our past history of calling seminary graduates would help or hurt our request. Response was that it doesn't hurt. Pastor Fondow also said that candidates are asked if they are open to a multi-staff ministry and some congregations that have had multiple staff in the past can no longer afford it. Russ Brown commented that most of our pastors have come to us from the seminary and that we have had good experiences. No further discussion. Motion carried.

Matt shared the rest of the survey results. The top five choices for congregational needs were: youth ministry, family ministry, assimilation of new members, fellowship and community connections. The top choices for professional skills and duties were: open and approachable, good communicator, administration, vision, pastoral care and community involvement. Pastor Neubauer said they had worked to keep the survey unbiased and not slanted toward a pastor vs. commissioned worker. Doug Kingsley commented that youth ministry should be considered a skill/quality and would like to see that considered when interviewing. Renae Olson added that it should encompass family ministry. Young children can't bring themselves to church. They need parents/grandparents to bring them.

Jerry Grudem asked Pastor Neubauer on his plans/expectations over the next several years. Pastor Neubauer first expressed his appreciation for the many awesome servants at St. Johns and the excellent call committee. Pastor Newton's work started an active youth group which continues to grow. He mentioned training youth on being a church member not just here but anywhere they go. He also mentioned the large retired population in our area which is a great mission field. Our retired members have been a great blessing. He said the future is unknown but that he plans to continuing serving here. His youngest, Sophia, graduates from high school the same year he will become eligible for social security and that maybe in ten years he'd be moving to "that table" pointing to where "retired" Pastors Fondow, Harvala and Neumann were sitting. A seminary candidate could possibly be on track to



move into the senior pastor position then. Pastor Neubauer expressed thanks for the cards and support following his ablation procedure. He is scheduled for knee replacement in late December and is working with Pastors Harvala and Fondow to cover his duties during January. Pastor Neubauer also shared that Pastor Newton is now serving as sole pastor at his new congregation. Please keep him and the congregation in your prayers. Larry Hetrick said Pastor Neubauer deserved a big hand and everyone applauded.

Motion by Martin Steffel, second Larry Hetrick and Paula Eischens to adjourn. Carried. Closed by singing the Doxology.

Pastor Neubauer said he plans to continue the stewardship theme for the coming year – glorify God, serve one another, be generous in every way. Generosity is not just monetary gifts to the poor but also being generous in our judgements of others and the way we talk to each other. Advent theme is "Born in Us." He is grateful to have Pastor Harvala here especially for the past Sunday mornings. There was no new member class due to full schedule. He is feeling pretty well now health wise. Knee surgery is scheduled for the end of December. Motion by Randy, second Connie to accept the report. Carried.

### **BOARD REPORTS**

**ELDERS – Jerry Grudem –** Elders continue to assist pastor. Discussion on having elders serve wine at communion. Would like some feedback from the congregation. They have been discussing various items for future presentation.

**EVANGELISM** – Connie Fondow reported. The Board of Evangelism is continuing preparations for our "Breakfast in Bethlehem" congregational and community outreach event scheduled for December 3 at 9:00 a.m. Encourage friends and family to attend even if you yourself are unable to. We will discuss St. Johns participation in "Toys for Girls and Boys and Tiny Tots" at our upcoming November board meeting. Connie has been in touch with Pastor Davis from Good Shepherd in North Fort Myers, Florida about damage sustained by Hurricane Ian. She read the most recent email she has received from him. We plan to help them financially by a special offering on November 6, basket fundraiser proceeds, Sunday School offerings and trivia even.

**CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – Lori Griess presented her report. Preschool- Open House was held and went well but not as well attended as in the past. We have 35 children enrolled – II three year olds and 24 four year olds. There are four children on the wait list. Four families are utilizing scholarships. Of the children attending preschool three attend St. Johns, two are from other LCMS churches, three from Calvary, three Catholic, six from Eastside, two from Faithbridge and ten with no listed church affiliation.

Sunday School – We had a meet and greet on August 21. Once again, the dunk tank was the center of attention. Rally Sunday was September 11 with the president of Concordia, St. Paul as guest speaker. Connie Fondow has taken over the office duties for the Sunday School program, which enables Shelley to teach. We are still exploring options for different Sunday School material. Also discussed presenting attendance awards during church instead of during the Sunday School closing. We are in desperate need of substitute teachers. Christmas program is December 18 at 2:00 p.m. Practice will be held the three Wednesday prior and the Saturday before. It was decided that the 2021-2022 offerings of \$500 would be given to Eagles Nest Healing Center for veterans and families.

"Food Truck Party" On a Roll with God! VBS was held August 7-11, once again in the evening to encourage participation by the parents and members of the congregation. We were able to donate over \$400 in offerings to the Hubbard County Food Shelf. Food Shelf director, Bob Hansen, came to receive the "check" from Pastor Neubauer. It worked well having crafts inside. There is an issue with the cost of the tent. This will need to be revisited prior to renting next year.

Release Time began on October 5. Teachers are in place but we can also use subs. Thank you to Laurie Kimball for all the hours that she has put in again this year organizing this much needed program. She does an amazing job.

Budget was reviewed and some changes were made. Agreed to proposed 5% wage increase for Mary and Kim.



CHURCH PROPERTIES – Randy Griess said things have been going pretty smooth. Jacob Lof is working on redoing the fire pit/picnic area as an Eagle Scout project. Currently working on getting cost estimates. The youth will do a fundraiser for the project and help with it. Plan to start the project in the spring.

**YOUTH** – Pastor Neubauer reported on the high school youth suppers. The kids prepare, serve and clean up the meal, then have a recreational activity such as cards or volleyball outside. He is trying to put together a family pumpkin event. Plans for bowling in Bemidji on November 13 and making pies for the community Thanksgiving meal.

**PARISH FELLOWSHIP** – Elayne Luiken reported. New member welcome/Pastor appreciation is scheduled for Sunday, November 6 between services. Ginny will send out the invitations to the new members. We'll have a basket out for cards for the pastors. We'll sponsor a potluck lunch after second service before the semi-annual voters meeting on Sunday, November 20. Christmas decorating will take place on Monday, November 28 starting at 9:00 a.m. Our board is in charge of preparing the breakfast for Breakfast at Bethlehem, Saturday, December 3, 9:00 a.m. We'll do prep the day before. Cookies and Carols will be Sunday, December 18 between services. Members are asked to bring Christmas cookies or candy to share. We'll make up cookie trays to deliver to shut-ins.

Reviewed the 2023 budget. Motion by Elayne, second Connie and carried to approve the budget as printed to present to the voters on November 20.

2023 Budget – Budget worksheets have been handed out to the board directors. Final figures should be ready by the October PPC meeting.

Went over the voters meeting agenda.

Call Update – Dr. Helm complimented the call committee on their outstanding job. Pastor Neubauer will check in with President Finnern about the process and interviewing candidates. Discussed if this would be done in person or online or both. Discussion on getting people back in church and survey results. Dr. Helm suggested organizing another meeting of the call committee to look at this more. Motion by Jerry, second Elayne to establish an assimilation committee for attendance improvement. Carried. An email will be sent to call committee members to see if they are willing to meet on November 16.

Elders have discussed going to one service in January. This would be a trial. Pastor Neubauer is working on talking to the pastor at St. Paul's, Perham, to see how switching to one service has worked for them. Discussion on times, etc.

Motion to adjourn by Jerry, second Connie. Motion carried. Closed with Doxology.
