



#### **BOARD REPORTS**

**ELDERS** – Mike Poole reported in Jerry Grudem's absence that the Elders continue to fill needs communion assistants and assist pastors.

**YOUTH** – Youth have done two Lenten meals. Haven't had some of our usual winter events. Planning Easter breakfast.

**EVANGELISM** – Connie Fondow reported. The trivia event raised \$2,451 for Good Shepherd Lutheran School in North Fort Meyers, Florida. Ginny will use the school/church online giving portal to forward this donation to Good Shepherd. Our thanks to Pastor Neubauer for his technology assistance; Ginny for all her support with running materials and making sure that the event ran smoothly; the Board of Parish Fellowship for their work pertaining to service of the meal; members who sponsored tables. We were especially pleased to see the number of participating youth and those outside our St. Johns membership.

The board is looking into the possibility of renewing our relationship with Diamond Willow for a once-amonth BINGO event with their residents.

"My Church" books were purchased for inclusion in the baptismal gift packages for members.

We assessed the "Breakfast in Bethlehem" event and have decided to repeat this community outreach in December of '23 and follow an every-other-year cycle for the future sponsorship of this project.

Connie also reported that she is working with a member of Trinity, Sauk Rapids to make metal art piece of our logo to hang in the front lobby. The expected cost is less than \$500 and we have dedicated funds to pay for it.

CHURCH PROPERTIES – Randy Griess reported things had been quiet until recently. There is a public hearing scheduled for April 10 at city hall about the conditional use permit for projects at the Century School. It really doesn't affect us so he doesn't think we need to attend.

Due to the large amount of snow, the roof has been leaking in various places. We've been working on getting it cleared. May put heat tape up in the valleys next year.

Samuelson Laney came to service the boiler. There is a ball press seal that needs to be replaced. This will be done in June after the heating season ends. They will get us a quote to replace the leaking hot water tank in the north women's bathroom as it would probably cost as much to repair as to replace it. We have prepaid for irrigator start up/shut down for the season. We have had to have the refrigerator



repaired twice in the past eight months due to refrigerant leaks. The door seals are worn and cracked and one on the right isn't closing. We should look at replacing the refrigerator. We purchased it in 2009.

Squirrels have been getting into the building. Janitor, Mike Riewer, has caught several. Rod gave Randy the name of a pest control contractor to contact.

**CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – Lori Griess presented her report. Sunday School attendance continues to be low. Release Time is going well. Planning to discuss preschool tuition at next meeting. VBS will be held August 6-10. We will serve a light supper for the kids before VBS. Discussed building security.

**PARISH FELLOWSHIP** – Elayne Luiken reported. The board prepared and served the meal for Trivia Night on March 26. We will serve the evening meal before Lenten services on Wednesday, March 29. On Sunday, April 16 we are hosting an afternoon teaching and playing cribbage. The confirmand meal will be Wednesday, May 3.

#### STEWARDSHIP/PUBLIC RELATIONS - No report.

#### **OLD/NEW BUSINESS:**

Call Update – Call dates at the seminaries are at the end of April. We will know then if we are assigned a candidate.

Board Nominations: Brandi and Roger are going off the Youth board. Connie will stay on Evangelism board but feels they need a new director so she declines to continue as director. Randy will check with Church Properties board at their next meeting. Lori will check with Christian Ed board. She also would like to step down as director. Elayne will check with Parish Fellowship board members. We need a director for Stewardship. Haven't checked with members yet. Also, haven't checked with Elders.


Governance Structure: Mike read the three books Ginny had and reported on them. Rod gave a review of another book recommended to him on missional living/engagement.
