Barb and I lived outside Wisconsin for most of the 80's. We loved many things about moving back to our home state but two things we especially missed here was people's

overall awareness of: the weather, and, our sports teams.

Weather. I mean, we loved living in metro New York and New Jersey, but people there don't know a watch from a warning to a wind chill to a weather vane. Heck, in Wisconsin, the longest single part of any newscast is typically the weather and they just don't give a vague forecast. The other night, one of the meteorologists displayed the difference in that day's forecast by the "European model" and the main US model and then talked in some detail, assuming the audience knew all about that. I mean, who doesn't, right? I exaggerate a little. Maybe you're not a weather nerd. But plenty of Wisconsites are.

Same with sports. I mean, people are sports fans everywhere, but in the case of say, the Packers and Badgers, the people of Wisconsin literally own the teams. With almost any sport you name, there's going to be an audience that's chiseling down to some deep details about personnel packages, rule changes, and the impact of a line-up change on fantasy teams, betting odds, and the upcoming draft.

We missed that degree of involvement, passion, and detail in both our sports fandom and our weather watching. BUT....it's also hard not to notice that it's hard for God, church, and faith to compete with such things!

The thing is they don't have to compete. They're not the same thing. If kept in their place, sports are entertainment, they're an escape, they're fun. We participate in them, watch them, and love the rare moment when you're with thousands of people and your team charges from behind to win! Bucks in 6, right?

Weather is similar. We all watch it and go out in it. If your work is related to agriculture, or outdoor installations, or sales of outdoor products, the weather impacts your livelihood every day. Of course, you're paying attention and ALL of us know the frustration of realizing it's dry, seeing the forecast for over an inch of rain and then it misses you entirely! Now I have to water my pots or garden after all!

God isn't part of a 24 hour news cycle. Parking at St. Luke is easier than at Lambeau. It's just different and because there's big money, especially in sports, they put it right in front of us all the time.

But the thing is, faith is as Big-Time as it gets. Healthy relationships, a calm inner self, perspective on failures, hope in the face of dying, joy in the arrival of new life, patience in passing on wisdom to others, defending those whose lives others undervalue...wow...those are all SO, SO much more important than the forecast or the standings. The huge challenge is realizing God doesn't force feed faith. We need to choose it again and again, and if we don't share it with others, it maybe just doesn't get shared.

Like the writer of Ecclesiastes says, there's a season and time for everything: the weather, report, your sports-fix of the day, and the time you carve out to pray, intentionally be a neighbor to others, and seek out wisdom from others who may know more. God is good that way. God is all about joy. God is also all about purpose and a passion for right-lived-life.

Do it all, this summer, people. Do it all. Not so that your schedule is more crammed! Do it all, so that your soul basks in the abundance of a God who delights in our passion, especially when faith is the spark for whatever fire burns brightest within us. $\sim John$


