Sharing the Peace

Call to Worship (Based on Today's First Reading)

One: It's summer! Warm nights. Cast a blanket on the grass. Stare up at the endless starry sky!

Many: Nice try. Can't do it. Too much smoke.

One: Wow, you're right. What Abram once, saw, we can't even see!

Many: Apparently the ancient Iranians were willing to fight their forest fires to prevent collateral smoke contamination to their south.

One: I'm pretty sure they just didn't have forest fires. Also no forest fire fighters.

Many: Which gets us to the reality of Abram's world.

One: We have problems. He had problems.

Many: Our common trait is that we often let the problems limit our solutions.

One: But then, God comes along, calls us by name and reminds us to see there has been abundance all along.

Many: Oh God, help our souls to see! Let us see that we aren't alone.

One: Let us see that there really are solutions to our problems.

Many: Let us see you in each other and in seeing you, be alive again...alive always! Amen!

First Reading: Genesis 15:1-6 Bulletin Insert

The most ancient traditions about Abraham and Sarah referred to him as "Abram." That gives us the immediate knowledge that what we are reading comes from the very, very beginnings of our faith tradition. Isn't it interesting then, that just as we often do today, the human being in the story thinks in terms of scarcity, while God thinks not just of abundance, but universe-filling abundance!

This easy and colorful craft helps kids remember that Jesus is their light no matter where they go!


What you need:

I'd like to feel along my way I'd left no sign of wrong.


