Lent is a season of penitence and self-examination. It is a time to devote ourselves even more fervently to the Word of God. Therefore, we are making some temporary changes to our Liturgy to pursue this goal. Here are the changes as noted in this week's service:

- The Lenten Season was historically a time of catechesis for new converts to the Christian Faith. We use this season to review those sections of Luther's Small Catechism that are pertinent to the theme determined by the Gospel Lesson for each service.
- ② Some of you may recognize the confession used here. It is from the "Communion of the Homebound" order used during quarantine for our small services in the Fellowship Hall. The direct, personal questions and answers call us to focus more intently on our confessions.
- ® Rather than employ the appointed Introits for each Sunday, we are using some of the Lament Psalms in their place. Their stark and striking language may offend us at first, but they lay before God the anger, disgust, anxiety and frustration that we often feel when dealing with shame and suffering. Thus they give us the words we're looking for when our prayers in time of oppression fall short.
