

Updates from the Call Committee

It's been a little over a year since the Call Committee began the process of finding a shepherd to lead our congregation. We often are asked why we have not been able to locate a pastor to fill this position. This not a unique situation to St. Matthews alone. There are currently over 500 vacancies synod-wide and 19 within the MN North District. The two seminaries will be placing only 84 pastors with congregations this spring. The majority of current pastors are over the age of 55 and the seminary graduating class is getting smaller and smaller each year. There are 34 Districts in the entire synod and everyone is pulling from the same pool of pastors. We are essentially dealing with a pastor shortage.

Pastors today are often considering a number of Calls, including the one they presently serve. We are doing our best to be patient so that we keep our direction at the forefront finding the one who fits the goals, missions and ministry of St. Matthews. One who is ready to serve in the role as sole pastor and works well in team ministry. May the Lord help us remain faithful in searching for the shepherd that has the gifts and abilities that would be a blessing to St. Matthews.

The Call Committee continues to have conversations about the future of St. Matthews and the pastor that would best serve our congregation. We have considered the option of the seminary again, but thought our best option is to continue to search for a pastor in the field. We are also discussing pastors that have been on our previous Call lists and those we have extended Calls to.

We ask that you continue to be patient and prayerful and to focus your heart and mind on the will of the Holy Spirit. God has prepared a pastor for St. Matthews and His timing is perfect.

President Fondow has sent us a call list of names of pastors from the field. We received a personal information form and self-evaluation tool for each pastor. This list and information are available to the congregation in the church office. We encourage everyone to take time to do your own research on each of these pastors and to watch or listen to their sermons. We would love for you to share your thoughts with us. Please note that this information is to be kept confidential among the congregational members. The call committee has been doing research on each of the pastors, narrowing the list down and conducting interviews. A congregational meeting has been scheduled for Sunday, May 8th following the 10:30am service to discuss these pastors and to take a vote on who we would like to extend a call to. We ask for continued prayers that God would be with us as we continue to do His work.





Stewardship Corner

Living Sacrifices

Stewardship is not just about giving money to the church. It includes this, to be sure, but it is not limited to it. Stewardship involves our whole life – everything we have and everything we are.

Let us not, though, fall into the trap of thinking that because we give of ourselves in one area then we can neglect giving in another. Stewardship is not stealing from Peter to pay Paul. It is not a game that we play whereby we justify ourselves in not giving a tenth of our income because we have given in some other way.

This is why our Lord warns: "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others." (Matthew 23:23) We are given to do both – tithe of ourselves and what we have.

And so it is that St. Paul makes his appeal to us: "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1–2)

We are to present our bodies as a living sacrifice to God. We are not to have the mind of the world, where we exchange equal weight of this for an equal weight of that and think that we have done what God has required. Our whole life is given over for service in and for the Church of God. This is to be done in thanksgiving for what God in Christ has accomplished for us. This is our spiritual worship, the reasonable response to what He has done for us. Not one for the other but all in all.

But what does this look like? St. Paul never lays down a general principle without also giving us some practical application of what shape that principle is to take concretely. He gives the general principle that our bodies are to be living sacrifices to God. And, after admonishing those who have been given particular gifts of grace to serve the church, St. Paul then speaks generally of what is expected of all. He says:

"Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." (Romans 12:9–13)

This is what it looks like to present your bodies as living sacrifices. This is how we live out the grace of God here in time.

Let us then heed the apostle's teaching. Let us present our bodies – everything that we have and everything that we are – as living sacrifices to God, our reasonable response to what God in Christ Jesus accomplished for us by His death and resurrection. Through this, we have forgiveness of sins, a new life in Christ, and eternal salvation. And through this worship, the grace of God is made manifest in His saints – for the church and the world.

In front, you can see the patient on a stretcher made of wooden poles, with the oxygen concentrator tied on, as well as a pole to support the IV. Bringing up the rear is the power supply (a noisy generator) to run the concentrator.

It had been almost three years since we last landed at this airstrip, so there was a bit of a concern as to its condition. How long will the grass be? How deep are the ruts from all the oxcarts that use the airstrip as a road? Will there be piles of rocks where kids have made soccer goals? Thankfully, despite all the rain we received in February, the airstrip was good and I could land to bring the patient back to Tana.

I've posted a video and some

photos of this flight on Instagram. Yes, after years of hesitation, I have taken the plunge and joined social media. For those interested in more frequent updates—mostly related to the work of MAF Madagascar—you can find me on Instagram at ryanunger8.

Speaking of February rain, we've had five tropical weather systems pass through Madagascar this year. Three tropical storms and two cyclones. While they brought much-needed rain to many places in the interior (especially the south where there has been extensive drought), large sections along the east coast were flooded and hit hard by wind damage. We did many hours of survey flying after the storms to assess the extent of the damage. We hope that the information gained from the surveys will help the agencies responding to make wise decisions as to where and how to help.



In the midst of medevacs and cyclones, we also had a request from some friends at YWAM to visit the south. Remember Deborah, the OM missionary from Ambovombe who we evacuated to Tana a year ago? Our friends with YWAM went to visit and teach in the churches that Deborah and her colleagues with OM have been faithfully working alongside for many years. Seeing these kinds of partnerships—between organizations and between nations—is always very encouraging. For YWAM to get there and back would have meant a week on the road. Instead, it was a two and half hour flight to the south with MAF, and then they drove the five hours to the closest city for the flight back with the local airline. Thank you for all of you who continue to pray and support the work of MAF in Madagascar. To God be the Glory!

It's been a while since we've given a proper update on our kids...

Caleb is in Sixieme—Grade 6—which means he spends an hour or two on the bus everyday heading to the middle/high school on the other side of town. This was one of the big reasons we hesitated to send him there. We tried an online school for a few months, but Caleb is incredibly social and this just didn't work. So we decided to give the French school a try. He comes back home in a good mood almost every day with something interesting from the day to share with us. After years of theatrics from him, we always pictured him on a stage. So when he was given the choice between Theater or Latin, we couldn't believe that he was considering the latter! Quid est?! One of his teachers described him as "perfectly bilingual"—in French that is. He's certainly more artistic than either of his parents and enjoys drawing. He is progressing well in piano. I might even say he has some natural talent even though he "hates it". He loves reading too, and has read *The Lord of the Rings* three times.

Renée is in CM1—Grade 4—and is the most kinetic of our kids. She's been a bouncer/rocker since before she could walk and has a natural athleticism. She is part of a "circus" after school activity and loves it. We wish she could get into gymnastics, but it isn't offered here, so she meets her need for bouncing and being upside down on our trampoline and a fabric swing in her room, and by doing handstands and cartwheels in the garden. Renée tolerates piano and has to work harder at it than her older brother, but it makes the success that much sweeter. She's recently gotten into art and loves creating beautiful scenes with pastels. She's fairly shy and likes her comfort bubble, but has found some good friends at school, including a new missionary kid in her class (not common at our school, so a huge blessing).

Joel is in CE1—Grade 2—and has expressed a love of math several times. He's very enthusiastic about piano, despite showing signs of being tone deaf (he'll happily play in perfect sync with his practice tracks, just in the wrong key). He can entertain himself for extended periods of time with just a stick and his imagination (and sound effects) in the garden, but can also be incessantly whiny for screen time. Joel plays soccer with friends (often vs dad) almost every afternoon in our yard and is developing decent skills.
