

ASK THE PASTOR

Do you have a Biblical or religious question you are seeking the answer to? Search no more...instead, ask the pastor! You can put your question in the box located on the table just outside the sanctuary. Keep your eye out for answers in the weekly bulletin.

Question: What is a good reference/study guide to help while reading the Bible? There are a lot of good resources for studying the Bible. My first suggestion would be to get a good study Bible. I would suggest the Lutheran Study Bible published by Concordia Publishing House. It is not something that most people think about, but I would also suggest the most recent edition of Luther's Small Catechism by CPH, as it serves as a fantastic reference book for different topics that may arise in reading the Bible.

Question: What does it mean when Jesus is referred to as the only begotten Son of God? Is it referring to his earthly birth or his eternal relationship with God the Father?

Awesome question, Joy!

"Begotten" is not a word used by us regularly, if ever. I know I don't. Yet, we use it in church on a weekly basis.

An old fashioned adjective, begotten is the past participle of the verb beget, which means to father or produce as offspring. Some translations use this term in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only <u>begotten</u> Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

"Begotten" is a translation of the Greek word monogenes. Ok? So what does monogenes mean? Monogenes has two primary definitions. The first definition is "pertaining to being the only one of its kind within a specific relationship." This is its meaning in Hebrews 11:17 when the writer refers to Isaac as Abraham's "only begotten son" (KJV). Abraham had more than one son, but Isaac was the only son he had by Sarah and the only son of the covenant. In other words, Isaac was unique among the other sons of Abraham, which is why monogenes is used in this context.

The second definition is "pertaining to being the only one of its kind or class, unique in kind." This is the meaning that is implied in John 3:16. John was very concerned with demonstrating that Jesus is the Son of God (John 20:31), and he uses monogenes to highlight Jesus as uniquely God's Son—sharing the same divine nature as God—as opposed to believers who are God's sons and daughters 'adopted' into the family by virtue of baptism and faith.

This is also why John uses a term for Jesus (the Logos, or Word) in the first chapter of his Gospel to show that Jesus, along with the Father, is Creator. All else is created. John was dealing with a false teaching very much related to the false teaching that the Nicene Creed was written to correct. The use of "begotten" in the Nicene Creed highlights the fact that Jesus is truly divine.

The false teaching that both John and The Nicene Creed exists is most well known in a very prominent teaching in the 3rd century called Arianism, called that because is most well know proponent was a church leader, Arius. Arianism held that the Logos, the Word, Jesus, had a beginning, came into being out of nothingness, and was not truly God. To correct controversies regarding the Divinity of Jesus, the Nicene Creed affirms Jesus is "begotten from the Father before all ages, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made. "
