

# **YOUTH NEWS**




The youth are collecting pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House. There is a collection basket under the youth board in the gathering space.

# What is the rule for using capital letters for the pronouns of the Trinity? Another great question!

Unfortunately, there is no specific rule on whether to capitalize a pronoun when it is used for any person of the Trinity. I have heard people debate this from both sides. One side says that rules are

rules and God does not want you to 'break' a grammatical rule for him (or is it Him? - 😊). Others say

that God is God and the rules don't apply to him (or is it Him? - 😊). So, it is really your preference. Personally, I go back and forth on this.

Relatedly, Christians do capitalize God when referring to any person of the Trinity, where 'god' refers to any false god.
