





(1 Timothy 2:1-4)

Holy Communion at Saint Michael's

This morning we are again privileged to participate in the miraculous Sacrament of the Altar! The Bible clearly teaches that the cup of blessing which we receive at the Lord's Supper is a participation in the blood of Christ and the bread which we break is a participation in the body of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). Paul also says: "Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself." (1 Cor. 11:28-29).

It is necessary, therefore, that we take the Lord's Supper seriously. At the Lord's Supper, we truly receive the real body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, in with and under the bread and the wine for the forgiveness of our sins.

Partaking of the Lord's Supper is also a sacred sign of the unity of faith and doctrine of those receiving it together. Therefore anyone who is not yet instructed, in doubt, or who holds a confession of faith or denominational affiliation other than that of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, is asked to speak with Pastor Nate before partaking of the Lord's Supper.

If you will be communing today we ask that you examine yourself by asking:

1. Do I repent of all of my sins, admit that I am a condemned sinner, and need the forgiveness of God?
2. Do I trust that the life, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ have earned my forgiveness?
3. Do I believe that the real body and blood presence of Jesus is miraculously united with the consecrated bread and wine of the Lord's Supper?
4. Do I intend to turn away from my sinful ways with the help of the Holy Spirit and live from now on in "peace along with those who call on the Lord?" (2 Timothy 2:22)

If your answer is "yes" to these questions; and if you are member of this or another LCMS congregation or have already spoken to Pastor Nate about receiving the Lord's Supper, then we invite and encourage you to join our fellowship at the Lord's Table.

If you will not be receiving the Lord's Supper this morning, you are still invited to come forward during the distribution. Simply leave your hands at your side when the pastor comes by with the bread, and he will give you a verbal blessing.

For those who are sensitive to alcohol, the cups in the center of the communion tray contain water with one drop of wine added.







Dear BMS Friends,

There was a tragedy in the village of Seine Bight two days ago. A fire destroyed a series of apartments known locally as the "Long Barracks." These are very small, single room, low-income apartments that were located north of our Christ Lutheran Church building on the opposite side of the side street. Thankfully, nobody was hurt, but all the apartments and their contents were completely destroyed. Many families, some with kids, lost everything. BMS immediately began working with Kirwin, the village council, and our missionaries on the ground to organize a relief effort, but just as a final plan was beginning to take shape we received the wonderful news that the greater Seine

Bight community and village council were doing an excellent job of rallying and providing the necessary support for the fire victims all on their own. The advice we are receiving from our local contacts in Seine Bight was to hold off on our financial and supply support for the time being to allow and encourage the internal, local support of the village.

Many of you have already reached out and asked how you can help. Thank you for that. We appreciate your love and concern. For now we ask that you join us, our missionaries on the ground, and the members of Christ Lutheran Church of Seine Bight in prayer for the victims and the efforts of the community. There may very well be opportunities for us to help the victims in the future in some unique ways. They have a long road ahead of them. If and when those more long-term needs pop up we will keep in contact with you concerning what you can do to help.
