- By tuning your car radio to 93.1 FM, you will be able to hear what Pastor Nate is saying through his microphone and hear the music coming from the piano. Please participate fully in the congregational responses, singing, and prayers!
- If a restroom is needed, one is available to you in the Education Building.
- We will be offering Holy Communion today. Please thoroughly read the instructions regarding Holy Communion in the section of the bulletin that immediately precedes the Service of the Sacrament.
- In order to register your attendance with us today, please fill out the attendance sheet on the back cover of your bulletin. You will tear this page off and hand it in with the offering as you exit the parking lot at the conclusion of the service.
- If you will be joining us for the Adult Bible Study in the Sanctuary or for Children's Sunday School in the Education Building, you will still exit the parking lot following service. Once you have crossed over the speed bump, simply turn right on Frio Street and re-enter the parking lot through the other entrance. Once all cars have exited, you can then choose anywhere you would like to park.
- When entering the sanctuary for Bible Study, please do not congregate in the narthex or in the aisles. Find a spot that is marked with green tape and sit only with those in your vehicle's group. Please sanitize your hands when entering the sanctuary. Masks are required. If you do not have one, masks are available in the sanctuary.
- The Adult Bible Study will be broadcast over the FM transmitter on the same frequency used during the service. If you would like to listen in on the Bible Study but do not want to enter the sanctuary, you are welcome to do so from your vehicle.

Important Information about Holy Communion Today

Today, we will celebrate Holy Communion, where Jesus Christ offers us his true body and true blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins. This Sacrament is also an expression of the unity in faith, doctrine, and practice of those who receive it together.

Since under these circumstances, it is impossible for Pastor Nate to visit this morning with anyone who is uncertain about our beliefs and practices surrounding Holy Communion, we ask that those who have not communed in our congregation in the past refrain from doing so today unless you are a member in good standing of another LCMS congregation.


We also understand that at this time there may be some individuals who would normally receive Holy Communion with us but who may have health or other concerns that would keep them from communing today. We understand these concerns and are supportive of each individual's responsibility for their own health.

Communion will be distributed by Pastor Nate and two Elders and will be brought to you in your car. If you will be communing today, please roll your window all the way down as a sign for us to come to you. If you will not be communing today, please crack your window about an inch as a sign for Pastor Nate to give you a verbal blessing.

For those who are sensitive to alcohol, the cups in the center of the communion tray contain water with one drop of wine added.
