- If you will be joining us for the Adult Bible Study in the Sanctuary or for Children's Sunday School in the Education Building, you will still exit the parking lot following service. Once you have crossed over the speed bump, simply turn right on Frio Street and re-enter the parking lot through the other entrance. Once all cars have exited, you can then choose anywhere you would like to park.
- When entering the sanctuary for Bible Study, please do not congregate in the narthex or in the aisles. Please sit only with those in your vehicle's group and leave as much distance as possible between groups. Please sanitize your hands when entering the sanctuary. Masks are required. If you do not have one, masks are available in the sanctuary.
- The Adult Bible Study will be broadcast over the FM transmitter on the same frequency used during the service. If you would like to listen in on the Bible Study but do not want to enter the sanctuary, you are welcome to do so from your vehicle.
