





³So he told them this parable: . . .

"There was a man who had two sons. ¹²And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. ¹³Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. ¹⁴And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. ¹⁵So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. ¹⁶And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything.

Treat me as one of your hired servants." 20And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. 21And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. 23And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. 24For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate.

²⁵"Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. ²⁷And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.' ²⁸But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, ²⁹but he answered his father, 'Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. ³⁰But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!' ³¹And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³²It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found."





The first will be replacing the roll up doors at the park building with solid walls, along with other necessary work at the park. Children needed! We are going to sing a song at the 9am Easter service on April 17th. We would like to practice with the children starting February 27th. Knitting and Crocheting Group in Need of Yarn: The knitting and crocheting group at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Giddings has been making warm hats and scarves with donated yarn for 6 years now. They have plenty of black, white, red, off white, and baby colors, but are running low on other colors. They would be thrilled with any yarn you have that you just don't use – you don't need to go out and buy it. Put it in a bag marked "Knitting and Crocheting Group" and drop it by the Immanuel church office. Every September they mail off the hats and scarves to Lutheran Social Services in the Midwest and Alaska where they are given to the poor, homeless, and migrants. This past September, 13 boxes (15" square) were mailed. If any ladies would like to join the group, they meet every 3rd Tuesday from 9am-12pm.
