She was a devoted wife, mother, and friend and enjoyed helping others by volunteering her time at church and other community functions. Amanda's family and friends would like to honor and remember Amanda and her educational-driven legacy by providing this scholarship opportunity to benefit a student attending Faith Lutheran High School in Warda, Texas in 2023-2024.

Available Scholarship:

One (1) scholarship for the amount of the annual tuition is available for a student who will be attending Faith Lutheran High School in Warda, TX for the 2023-2024 school year. This scholarship automatically renews annually (for an additional 3 years) assuming the student continues to meet the criteria as outlined below.

Details:

- The scholarship considers academic performance, leadership potential, and participation in school and community events.
- Applicants must have a minimum grade average of B+ for all 7th and 8th grade courses.
- Scholarship funds will be paid in August, 2023 for tuition for the Fall Semester of the 2023-2024 school year and in December, 2023 for the Spring Semester of the 2023-2024 school year. It will be the student's responsibility to submit to Cyndy Zoch, at each time, an invoice for each semester's tuition. Scholarship payment will be made in the name of the recipient to Faith Lutheran High School.
- Applicants must have the endorsement of the Faith Lutheran High School principal, Mrs. Nikki Kueck, on their application attesting that the applicant is a qualified fit for this scholarship program and that they have been accepted as a student at Faith Lutheran High School. Application deadline is May 1, 2023. Late applications are **not** accepted.
- The scholarship will be paid every semester the student attends Faith Lutheran High School in Warda, TX and only if the student maintains a 3.25 GPA per semester and outstanding merit within the school and community. The endorsement of the Faith Lutheran High School principal, attesting to the applicant's GPA and school service, is required every semester. The scholarship recipient may also submit attestations from other community leaders outlining community services performed outside of Faith Lutheran High School to be considered in the biannual review.

In 2016, Amanda was diagnosed with breast cancer. While going through chemo treatments and surgery, she continued to teach. In the summer of 2017, Amanda was diagnosed with a glioblastoma, a rare but fatal type of brain tumor and passed away in December of 2018.

Amanda was a devoted wife to Cory, mother to Emma, and friend to many and enjoyed helping others by volunteering her time at church and other community functions. Amanda's family and friends would like to honor and remember Amanda and her educational-driven legacy by creating the Amanda Knox Memorial Scholarship Fund, which is a 501(c)(3) designated non-profit organization. Hello to our mission partners at St. Michael,

I wanted to give you a quick update on some rapidly changing dynamics with our current family. What a story this one has been! In early February, we welcomed in a mom and 5 kids from Turkey. They are originally from Allepo, Syria, but were displaced when Assad bombed their city into ruins during the war. They fled as refugees to Turkey seven years ago, and then the dad died shortly after from cancer. Two of the children have some fairly significant medical issues (they describe it as holes in the heart and lung), so Turkey opted to put them at the top of the list for export since they couldn't (or wouldn't) provide the necessary medical care. They left for the Istanbul airport the day before the recent earthquake hit. Their city was right at the epicenter, so they turned back around to check on family, but had to leave shortly after to make their flight to the U.S. So, when they arrived at the Houston airport they were exhausted and traumatized. The first couple of days was them either sleeping or checking for news from their family in Turkey to see who had survived. When all was said and done, 11 of their immediate family had been killed. 3 out of 7 kids from her brother's family, her sister and two kids from another family, etc. What a devastating time....and yet I am so thankful that God brought them to Abba's House where they could process all this loss in a loving and safe space. They have been an absolute delight....maybe my favorite family yet (though I say that with each family).

Now, for the big change. We heard two days ago from the agency that her oldest son, daughter-in-law, and two children had been approved to come and will be arriving tonight! So, that family will be placed directly into the Westward Square Apartments in SW Houston, and they are working to find an apartment for Faten and her family sometime next week. Since they now have family in town, it makes sense for them to be together, for the kids to get enrolled in school, etc. While we hate that they will be leaving us several weeks earlier than we expected, it seems to be the best thing for their family.

My apologies for the sudden change . . . but that's pretty much the norm in this line of work.

I pray all is going well for you in this Lenten season.
