
which comes out like a bridegroom leaving his chamber, and, like a strong man, runs its course with joy.

Its rising is from the end of the heavens, and its circuit to the end of them, and there is nothing hidden from its heat.




Poinsettias: If you purchased a poinsettia to decorate the sanctuary, please plan to take it home after the service **on Sunday, January** 7th.
