Moving toward Weekly Communion - Why Now?

I hope that you have had the chance to look at the pamphlet entitled "The Blessings of Weekly Communion" which we handed out following last week's service. If you did not get a chance to receive one, more copies are available in the church entryway. I pray that you found it helpful in examining the Bible's teachings about Holy Communion and the frequency of Holy Communion throughout the history of the Christian Church.

Some of you may be wondering why right now is the time that we are making a change in the frequency of our celebration of the Lord's Supper. Why did I not lead us toward this change as soon as I arrived in Winchester, or why not wait longer before making a change? I would like to take a few words to explain. First off, pastors and congregations are always growing in the Lord and in His Word. Part of that growth is to take a fresh look at things from time to time and ask what changes the Lord might want to see us make in our lives individually or together as a congregation. I believe that the Lord is leading our congregation at this time to restore this Biblical and historic practice of the church. My experience growing up was in a twice-a-month communion congregation and when I arrived here, such was also the practice. I didn't see any real need to make a change at that time. As I have continued to grow in my appreciation for the Lord's Supper and have come to see evermore the comfort and peace that it brings to us sinners, the question began to become: "Why not celebrate it weekly?" Over time also, more LCMS congregations have been practicing every Sunday communion and it has proven to be beneficial to them. Another factor leading toward making the change now, is that I have become personally accustomed to the practice since when we began worship services at Epiphany – Bastrop we decided to celebrate the Supper weekly in that congregation. Finally, other pastors and congregations in the area are either currently making the shift to every Sunday communion or are seriously considering it. In our meetings together, iron sharpens iron, and the witness of other pastors and congregations in this way has been encouraging. So, why now? Why not now?

As a reminder, today in Adult Bible study, our topic in the "What About?" series will cover "What About the Sacrament of the Altar?" All are encouraged to join us in Bible Study where I will be sure to answer any questions that you might have about this upcoming change.

You are also welcome to reach out personally to me, I will be happy to speak with anyone regarding their questions.
