## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT HOLY COMMUNION TODAY:**

Today, we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion, in which our Lord Jesus Christ gives His true body and blood under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins. This Sacrament is also a confession of the unity in faith, doctrine, and practice of those who receive it together.

If you are a confirmed member in good standing of Saint Michael's Lutheran Church or another congregation of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, we welcome you to commune with us today. However, if this is not the case, we ask that you refrain from communing today. If you have questions, please speak to the pastor. He would be happy to meet with you to talk about the blessings of church membership and arrange for you to be a part of our instruction leading toward church membership and the reception of Holy Communion at Saint Michael's.

If you will not be receiving the Lord's Supper today, you are still welcome to come forward during the distribution to receive a blessing from our pastor. In this case, please cross your arms across your chest as a sign that you desire a pastoral blessing.

Howdy, church family!

We're back from New Orleans, with tired feet, full hearts, and probably still a few powdered sugar stains from beignets.

Our adventure started early on Friday, July 18<sup>th</sup> as we loaded the van packed with teens, snacks, pillows, and excitement. From that moment on, it was non-stop, in the best way!

We explored the city, solved our way through an escape room, and spent time serving others by assembling braille books and helping Ysleta Lutheran Mission prepare supplies for families near the El Paso/Juarez border. These youth jumped right in with joy, energy, and big hearts.

Each night, we joined 20,000 other Lutherans in the Superdome for powerful worship and messages that reminded us we are all fearfully and wonderfully made, and that we belong. The music, the energy, and the community were unforgettable.

We wrapped up with worship and a trip to the National World War II Museum, where we were reminded of freedoms we're blessed to have, freedom to worship a wonderful God and a responsibility to use that freedom.
