# WELCOME TO WORSHIP

### FAREWELL TO ALLELUIA

On February 23<sup>rd</sup>, the theme of our worship services will be the Transfiguration of Our Lord. Witnesses to the glory of God in the face of Jesus will be unable to avoid reflecting that glory in the world. It was true for Moses. It was doubtless true for Peter, James, and John. We pray that it will be true of all of us who see the glory of the Lord in the Word and in the supper and who are being “transformed into the same image” by the Spirit of God.

At the same time, February 23<sup>rd</sup> is also the last Sunday in the season of Epiphany, and on Ash Wednesday we will enter into the season of Lent. So, on February 23<sup>rd</sup>, we will join with many congregations in keeping the ancient practice of fasting from singing or speaking “alleluia” through the forty days of Lent. Based on the Hebrew word, *hallelu yah*, meaning “praise the Lord,” *alleluia* has been a word of great praise to God in the life of the church. Because of the penitential character of the Lenten season in the Western church, singing or saying the word *alleluia* has historically been suspended during Lent’s forty days.

The hymn “Alleluia, Song of Gladness,” which we sing as our Hymn of Praise during worship on Transfiguration Sunday, contains a translation of an eleventh-century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. During the singing of the Sending Song, the alleluia banner will be carried from the sanctuary. But, following through the seasons of the church year, the alleluia banner will return with great joy at the first *alleluias* of the Easter season.

## ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP

### FEBRUARY 26<sup>TH</sup> 6:00PM

Make Wednesday worship a part of your Lent discipline. On Ash Wednesday, we remember that “we are dust and to dust we shall return.” We receive the imposition of ashes as we are marked with the sign of the cross, remembering our frailty and sinfulness. We are reminded, as well, of the death Jesus died, and His victory over sin and death. We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion. You are encouraged to remain silent before worship and after worship, allowing opportunity for prayer and reflection.

### LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS

Soup suppers, a part of our Lenten tradition, return this year beginning on Wednesday, February 26<sup>th</sup> (Ash Wednesday) and continue through Wednesday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, serving 5:00 P.M.—5:45 P.M. ### AT THE NAME OF JESUS


Readers bring Scriptures to life. It is easy yet meaningful and an important service. Contact church office if you are interested in any of these areas of service.

# FINANCIAL SUMMARY



- ◆ FYTD = Fiscal Year-to-Date. St. Paul Lutheran’s fiscal year begins on 01-Oct.
- ◆ The 2019-20 fiscal full year budget is \$240,000. Three months (i.e., one-fourth) of the fiscal year were completed as of December month-end.
- ◆ Regular Offerings for the current year-to-date fiscal year are lower than the prior year-to-date period by \$4,855 ( $\$51,206 - \$56,061 = \$4,855$ ), and less than one-fourth of the budgeted fiscal year amount of \$60,000 (i.e., one-fourth of  $\$240,000 = \$60,000$ ).
- ◆ The cancellation of Sunday services on 01-Dec-19 due to the snowstorm adversely impacted the amount of current year FYTD General Offerings.

# COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES : MONDAY, DEC. 16 2019

**Mission:** *St. Paul Lutheran Church is a welcoming family bringing Christ into people's lives by developing, nurturing and supporting disciples.*

**Council Members Present:** Betty Eisenhauer, Tom Prohl, Dave DeCock, Greg Ehlke, Karen Peterson and Pastor Frank Kauzlarich  
**Not Present / Excused:** Todd Rockway, Jim Tyndall  
**Others attending:** Shawn Mathys

## **Meeting Call to Order:**

The meeting was called to order by Betty Eisenhauer at 6:00 P.M. following a pre-meeting financial briefing for new and returning Council members provided by Greg Ehlke.

## **Devotions:**

Karen Peterson provided an opening devotion and a prayer.

## **Agenda Approval:**

The previously circulated agenda was reviewed and accepted.

## **Minutes:**

The minutes from the prior Council meeting of November 18, 2019 were reviewed and approved.

## **Community of Faith Report – All**

- Pastor Frank advised the Council that an Epiphany dinner will be held after the 9:30 A.M. service on Sunday, January 12, 2020.
- He also noted that ornaments were still available on the Giving Tree in the narthex to assist others in need.
- Volunteers are still needed to assist with the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services.

## **Pastor's Report – Pastor Frank Kauzlarich**

- Pastor Frank reported that over forty families in the congregation were in need of prayers for loved ones facing medical challenge and that many members were receiving pastoral care given their needs.
- The quarterly letter to the voting and associate members was mailed on Saturday, Dec. 14<sup>th</sup>, along with the quarterly giving statements prepared by the Financial Secretary. The Treasurer noted that the mailing consisted of one hundred and ten letters to voting and associate members.
- Goals for the coming year are being established for the Administrative Assistant and are expected to include: (i) reviewing the role of the 360 database, (ii) executing just-in-time ordering, and (iii) transitioning to coordination of preparation of all bulletins and the monthly Epistle
- Pastor noted it is important for members to inform Patrick of changes in events so they may be timely and properly conveyed to members.
- Pastor reported BJ Mueller asked to be removed from membership given her planned retirement and move; upon motion, made by Tom and seconded by Karen, the request was accepted with regret.

## **Council Membership**

- Betty reported that Todd Rockway had submitted a letter of resignation from membership on the Church Council, principally due to new responsibilities teaching at NWTC which reduced his time to devote to Council activities. The resignation was accepted with regret.
- Pastor will seek to find a replacement to fill the remainder of Todd's term on the Church Council.

# COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (CONT.)

## **Action Items from Various Ministry Reports:**

- The Communications and Technology Ministry reported upon the results of the communications survey. Fifty-six surveys were completed to date and will be reported upon in the January Epistle.
- It was reported Gary Jones will continue to serve as the web site administrator.
- The Treasurer noted the authorized signers for the four accounts maintained at Nicolet National Bank needed to be updated. It was agreed Tom Prohl should be added as a signer and that Shawn Mathys and Betty Eisenhower should continue as signers on each account.

## **Financial Report:**

- The financial summary for November, presented by Greg, highlighted that Offerings for the month approximated \$14,300 and Ministry expenses approximated \$20,600. The Treasurer's report noted that the current fiscal year budget projects that \$240,000 of Offerings will be needed to meet expected full fiscal year Ministry Expenses.
- The Treasurer, with assistance from the Financial Secretary, is currently analyzing recent years' monthly trends to better reflect variances in monthly giving amounts to better reflect monthly Offering amounts.
- A copy of the November 2019 Financial Summary was ordered to be uploaded to the members' section of the St. Paul web site and that a copy of the financial statements and schedules provided to the Council be filed with the records of the meeting.

## **Old Business**

### **Post-Secondary Scholarship Grants:**

- Karen Peterson reported that three students continuing with their post-secondary education had submitted applications and met the requirements for scholarship grants from St. Paul. To avoid any conflict of interest, Karen then recused herself from voting citing a need to avoid a conflict of interests. Upon motion, made by Betty and seconded by Tom, scholarship grants of \$500, payable in December to the schools of each student, were approved for: (i) Aleah Bauldry, (ii) Ava Beaudot, and (iii) Anika Peterson.

### **Ministry Self-Assessment Status:**

- It was agreed that responsibilities currently assigned to the Evangelism Ministry should be unbundled and separately performed.
- Other Ministry self-assessments continue to be ongoing and will be reported upon at a later date.

### **Local Benevolence Ministry Progress:**

- It was agreed that Karen Peterson would act as the Council liaison to this new initiative, with Pastor as an ex-officio member, at least three lay members and a member of the Endowment Fund Committee to serve as members. The goal is to have the group up and running in January.
- A list of recent charitable benevolences made by St. Paul were provided by the Financial Secretary to Karen to help stimulate discussion within the new group about potential local charitable organization recipients.

### **Council Liaisons to Committees:**

- Greg agreed to act as a liaison to the Endowment Fund Committee while Tom will continue to serve as liaison to the Property/Maintenance/Cemetery Ministry and Dave will continue to serve as a liaison to the Communications and Technology Ministry.
- Activities of the Worship and Ministry are continuing to be analyzed. Responsibilities for certain activities within that Ministry may be distributed to designated individuals.

### **Office Relocation and Budget Approval:**

- Tom reported upon the project plan to relocate the church office into the adjoining room to better utilize existing space and enhance privacy for consultations by Pastor. Upon motion, made by Tom and seconded by Dave, a budget of up to \$3,000, to be funded from currently undesignated Memorial funds, for the project was approved.

# COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (CONT.)

## **Administrative Assistant Performance Appraisal:**

- The performance appraisal for the new Administrative Assistant, Patrick Cain, was completed. Consistent with the terms of his hiring, Patrick's satisfactory performance entitled him to an hourly rate of \$16 per hour, up from \$15 as of his hiring date, after 60 days. Upon motion, made by Betty and seconded by Tom, the new hourly rate of \$16/hour was unanimously approved.

## **Council Meeting "Minute Taker":**

- There is a need to find a member with corporate governance or note taking skills to assist the Council in taking notes; Greg agreed to make an announcement at the upcoming Sunday services in that regard.

## **Annual Council Events Calendar:**

- Development of an annual Council events calendar is in progress and Council members were reminded to ensure their respective Ministries events are incorporated into the calendar being compiled.

## **Winter Council Meeting Times:**

- The Council decided to hold the monthly Executive Committee meeting on the second Monday of each month at 1:00 P.M. and each monthly Council meeting on the third Wednesday of the month at 1:00 P.M. during the winter months.

## **Sound System / Hearing Loop Approval:**

- Dave reported on progress for these two projects. After discussion, upon motion by Dave and seconded by Tom, funding for the two projects in the amounts of \$4,803.68 and \$5,466.44, respectively, from the undesignated Memorial funds was approved.

## **Council Long-Range Plan & 2020 Objectives:**

- Discussion of the long-range plan and its relation to 2020 Council objectives was tabled until next year.

## **New Business**

### **Operation Christmas Child:**

- Discussion about the program for future years was tabled.

### **Staff Christmas Holiday Gifts:**

- After discussion, upon motion by Tom and seconded by Dave, a holiday gift in the amount of \$100, net of withholding tax, was approved for the musical staff, the cleaning staff and the Administrative Assistant.

### **Church Closing Procedure Due to Weather Conditions:**

- In light of the need to cancel the Sunday, December 1<sup>st</sup> worship services due to adverse weather conditions, Pastor confirmed for the Council the procedures followed in determining the call to cancel services when needed due to inclement weather. No change in the procedure was deemed necessary.

## **Adjournment:**

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 7:45 P.M. with the praying of The Lord's Prayer.
