PROJECT – DUE FEBRUARY 14

Dear Catechism families:

Blessings in Christ. At the beginning of the year, catechesis projects were assigned. I would like to suggest that sometime during the next month, all of our catechumens do their Church Member Interview project and write up their report. I am giving February 14 as the deadline for this project, so everyone has enough time to think about it.

Below is the project instructions as was handed out at the beginning of the year.

GROUP 1 PROJECT INSTRUCTIONS

The following is a list of instructions for writing your Group 1 Project reports. These are only guidelines and should *not* be written as a list of questions and answers. **Reports should be complete sentences and in paragraph form.** (At the very least = 200 words). In your reports, answer the following questions:

Church Member Interview –

This project shows our catechumens how much history is connected to their congregation that they may not be aware of. Catechumens will each interview an older member of their church that they are not related to, who has been a member of their congregation for a long time.

- Potential questions: How long have you been a member of St. Paul, Wisner?
- What is your earliest memory from St. Paul?
- (*If the member was confirmed here*), what was it like when you were in Catechism and when you were confirmed?
- What is different at St. Paul from when you were in Sunday school?
- What is the same at St. Paul from when you were in Sunday school?
- Why does the Bible and the Lutheran teaching matter to you?
- How many pastors do you remember who served at St. Paul?

Start thinking about who you want to interview. Parents are certainly welcome to sit in and listen during the interview as well. You might be pleasantly surprised at what you could learn about your church.

Again, the due date is FEBRUARY 14. 200 words minimum. (And I've told the catechumens this, but I'll say it here too. I'm not an English teacher. I don't care about spelling. Just as long as I can understand the report, that's good for me). Blessings on this project and I hope you find it interesting.
