

"So they took Jesus, ¹⁷ and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called The Place of a Skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. ¹⁸ There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them (John 19:16-18, ESV)."

In Wisner, the people have a knack for celebrating. Everything. We throw parties and celebrate everything. This month, we will have a whole day dedicated to the celebration of St. Patrick, a man who suffered greatly for the sake of the faith. In past months, we have celebrated school sports and activity victories. We have celebrated births, life milestones, and anything else we can think of. People like celebrating. It's fun. I personally love celebrating. I love throwing parties.

On March 31, the Western Church will celebrate Easter, the Resurrection of our Lord. Churches will be fuller than usual. Youth groups throughout the nation will serve breakfast to their older parishioners. Music will blare and shout of the Victory of Jesus. But just like every worldly, manmade celebration, there was a price to be paid. From St. Patrick's enslavement, to the hard work and life's labors which get us to our celebrations, there is always a sacrifice.


In the case of the Easter Celebration, there is the sacrifice of God's only begotten Son upon the cross (John 3:16). There, between two others, he gave himself as the sacrifice to atone for the sin of the world. It isn't pretty. In fact, the crucifixion was ugly. When Christians ponder the crucifixion, we are to ponder our own sinfulness and need of repentance. That's uncomfortable. That's also necessary. There is no Easter without Good Friday. The Easter Victory of Christ over sin, death, and the devil in his resurrection is joyful because of the hope we have in the resurrection and our unity in Christ through baptism. Our union with Christ through baptism gives us the hope that we will enjoy the resurrection to life eternal with Him (Romans 6:5).

Many people, even those who profess to be Christians will miss the above point about the crucifixion. They want the celebration without the pain. The glow of family warmth around a table with ham and chocolates fades quickly. The emotional high of a well-constructed and executed church service replete with candles and trumpets is soon a distant memory.

The joy of your salvation in the glory of the Lord upon his cross and at the empty tomb are your real reasons to celebrate. Come to church on Good Friday and Easter Sunday, so that you may say with Mary Magdalene, "I have seen the Lord (John 20:18)." Marvel at his glory. Come to church each week and receive the gifts of his crucifixion in the Lord's Supper-the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. For Christ is risen! Alleluia! Amen.
