Good News

- God loves you.
- God came to rescue you from your sin.
- Jesus was punished for our sins on a cross.
- Jesus came back to life and lives forever.
- He will hear you when you call to him.
- You can ask God for forgiveness and trust your life to Jesus.
- If you do, God will accept you, live in you, and give you eternal life.

1. As you look at the Good News listed on the other side of this sheet, what item seems like the best part of the news? What part would you find the easiest to share with someone? Which part would you find the hardest to explain? Why?
2. What part of the Ephesians 2:8-10 do you understand as "good". What additional items can you add to the Good News list? See also John 3:16-19 to help add to the list.
3. When you think about Evangelism, who or what first comes to your mind, the person who first shared Jesus with you, or someone far away normally called a "missionary"?
4. When you think about the "Lost," (those who do not know Jesus yet), what first comes to your mind? Was there a time when your heart was burdened for people to come to know Jesus? What happened? See Romans 10:14-15.
5. In addition to having a Good News list, what is most important for a person to have in order to Evangelize? See Matthew 28:18-19 and Acts 1:8.
6. From these last two passages, how is the command of Jesus: "go and make disciples" and His promise: "you will be my witnesses" an encouragement you?
