Nehemiah 3 & 4

Connecting the Dots . . . (after sermon discussion)

1. How are you at work repairing and building God's Kingdom right now? What is one thing you would change about your neighborhood/street/town? How can you have "a mind to work" in making that change?
2. Nehemiah 3:5 says certain nobles would not "stoop to serve their Lord." Have you seen this in your life? Have you been unwilling to serve the Lord in the way He calls you?
3. Who are you currently watching build the Kingdom of God near you? How is their work encouraging you to keep building? How are you building together with them?
4. What kind of opposition are you facing right now that threatens to distract, discourage, or dismantle the Kingdom of God work in front of you?

Digging Deeper Together (for further study during the week)

1. There were some unqualified people for the task of wall building (priests, merchants, perfumers, goldsmiths, etc.). How does God equip those that are not qualified? (Exodus 31:1-6; 1 Samuel 16:11, 13; 2 Corinthians 3:4-6)
2. If so many hard-working people reject Jesus Christ, what is so essential about building my life upon Him and His work on the cross? (1 Peter 2:7-10, Mark 9:38-41)
3. How do I build the Kingdom of God with others and take my stand against the enemy of my soul at the same time? (1 Peter 2:11-12, 2 Timothy 2:8-13, Ephesians 4:13-16, Ephesians 6:10-13)
4. How did the Israelites react to the jeering and rage of their enemies in chapter 4? How can we react to opposition? (Nehemiah 4:6-9, Luke 6:22-28)
