Henri Nouwen tells the story of an old man who used to meditate every morning on the bank of the Ganges River. One morning, after his meditation, he saw a scorpion floating helplessly on the water. As the scorpion washed closer to the bank, the old man reached out to rescue the drowning creature. As soon as he reached it, however, the scorpion stung him. Instinctively the man withdrew his hand. A minute later, though, he tried again. This time the scorpion stung him so badly with its poisonous tail that the hand became swollen and his face contorted with pain.

At that moment, a young man passed by and saw what had happened. He shouted: "Hey, stupid old man, what's wrong with you? Only a fool would risk his life for an ugly, evil creature. Don't you know you could kill yourself trying to save that ungrateful scorpion?" Looking into the stranger's eyes the old man said calmly, "My friend, just because it is the scorpion's nature to sting, that does not change my nature to save."

This is such a wonderful story about the love of God. Just because it is our nature to sin, that does not change God's nature to save. It seems to me that ever since the fall of humankind recorded in Genesis 3, God has been on a rescue mission to save the world. God has been on a rescue mission to save you and me! The tragedy seems to be that every time God reaches out God's hand to help us, we sting God with our disobedience and rebelliousness. We continue to sting one another with the poison of our hatred, prejudice and indifference.

The good news is that we have a God who doesn't give up on us. We have a God whose very nature it is to save. ***For God did not send his Son to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. (John 3:17).*** The love of God in Jesus Christ is the vaccine that saves us from the sin that continues to poison our lives and our relationships. It is, as the spiritual says, "the balm that heals the sin-sick soul."

During the course of Lent let us remember and rejoice in this life saving love from above. Let us reflect upon all that our Lord endured for you and me through his sufferings and death on the cross. By humbly confessing before the Crucified One our "scorpion" like ways to sting and poison the world God has given us, we will come to praise the Risen One who gives us hope and life eternal.
