WEEK 49

PROVERBS 1:1—9:18

In this week we have looked at exhortations to embrace wisdom, a warning against rejecting wisdom, the moral benefits of wisdom, the further benefits of wisdom, wisdom as supreme, warnings against adultery, wisdom's call, and the invitations of wisdom and folly.

What is a proverb?

What do those who lay in wait actually wait for (Proverbs 1:8-19)?

What path does the adulteress lead one down (Proverbs 2:16-19)?

What are the benefits of honoring the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of your crops (Proverbs 3:9-10)?

Proverbs 4:11 says, "I guide you in the way of wisdom and lead you along straight paths." What is meant by straight paths?

While the lips of an adulteress may seem sweet as honey, what does an adulteress really bring (Proverbs 5:3-6)?

What does Proverbs 5:15-19 have to say to a husband about his wife?

Proverbs 6:1 say, “If you have struck hands in pledge.” What does it mean to strike a hand in a pledge?

What are the six things the Lord hates, seven that are detestable to him (Proverbs 6:16-19)?

What does the previous answer tell us on how we should treat others?

Proverbs 7:2 says, “Keep my commands and you will live; guard my teachings as the apple of your eye.” What does “apple of your eye” mean?

What does Proverbs 7:11 tell us about how an adulteress behaves?

Proverbs 8:3 tells us that wisdom is “beside the gates leading into the city, at the entrances, she cries aloud.” What is the significance of the city gate?

Proverbs 9:1 tells us, “Wisdom has built her house; she has hewn out its seven pillars.” Why does wisdom build her house with seven pillars?
