WEEK 51

PROVERBS 22:1—ECCLESIASTES 2:26

In this week we have looked at the sayings of the wise, more Proverbs of Solomon, the sayings of Agur, the wife of noble character, and looking at things that are meaningless.

What do the rich and poor have in common (Proverbs 22:2)?

Proverbs 22:13 tells us: “The sluggard says, “There is a lion outside!” or, “I will be murdered in the streets!”” Why would a lion be in the street?

Why should people not make friends with those who are easily angered (Proverbs 22:24-25)?

What does Proverbs 23:26-28 compare a prostitute and a wayward wife to?

Proverbs 24:7 tells us: “Wisdom is too high for a fool; in the assembly at the gate he has nothing to say.” What was the assembly at the gate?

What does Proverbs 24:28-29 tell us about how we should treat our neighbor?

Proverbs 25:13 tells us: “Like the coolness of snow at harvest time.” What is meant by coolness of snow?

What does Proverbs 26:4-5 tell us concerning answering a fool?

Proverbs 27:13 tells us: “Take the garment of one who puts up security for a stranger.” Why did people take a garment for security?

What does Proverbs 27:19 tell us about a man’s heart?

Proverbs 28:14 tells us: “Blessed is the man who always fears to LORD.” What does it mean to fear God?

What does Proverbs 29:2 tell us about governing official’s relation to the people under them?

What does the sayings of Agur say is the characteristic that makes a person the most ignorant of all men (Proverbs 30:2-3)?

Does Proverbs 31:6-7 say that it is ok to drink all the time?

Proverbs 31:19 tells us: “In her hand she holds the distaff and grasps the spindle with her fingers.” What are a distaff and spindle?

Ecclesiastes 1:3 tells us: What does man gain from all his labor at which he toils under the sun?” What does the phrase “under the sun” mean?

What does it mean, “Like the fool, the wise man too must die!” (Ecclesiastes 2:16)?
