ECCLESIASTES 3:1—SONG OF SONGS 3:11

In this week we have looked at a time for everything, oppression, toil, and friendlessness, that advancement is meaningless, that we should stand in awe of God, that riches are meaningless, wisdom, obeying the king's command, a common destiny for all, that wisdom is better than folly, bread upon the waters, remembering your creator while young, the conclusion of matter, and the beginning of Song of Songs.

What is meant by the phrases *a time to hate* and *a time for war* (Ecclesiastes 3:8)?

Why are two better than one (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12)?

Why is advancement meaningless (Ecclesiastes 4:13-16)?

Ecclesiastes 5:1 tells us: "Go near to listen rather than to offer the sacrifice of fools." What was the sacrifice of fools?

What meaningless thing is mentioned in Ecclesiastes 6:1-2, and why is it meaningless?

What is meant by "death is the destiny of every man; the living should take this to heart" (Ecclesiastes 7:2)?

Ecclesiastes 7:16 tells us: “Do not be overrighteous.” How can someone be too righteous?

What is the purpose of obeying the king (Ecclesiastes 8:2-8)?

Ecclesiastes 9:8 tells us: “Always be clothed in white.” What did it mean for someone to wear white clothes?

What is meant by the rich in Ecclesiastes 10:6?

Ecclesiastes 11:1 tells us: “Cast your bread upon the waters.” What does it mean to cast bread on waters?

What is the conclusion of the matter (Ecclesiastes 12:13-14)?

Why is this book called the Song of Songs?

How does Solomon describe the eyes of his lover?
