

TODAY'S LIGHT BIBLE STUDY

WEEK 55

ISAIAH 26:1—39:8

In this week we have looked at a song of praise, a prophecy concerning deliverance of Israel, woe to Ephraim, woe to David's city, woe to the obstinate nation, woe to those who rely on Egypt, the kingdom of righteousness, the women of Jerusalem, distress and help, judgment against the nations, Joy of the redeemed, Sennacherib threatening Jerusalem, Jerusalem's deliverance foretold, King Hezekiah's prayer, the fall of Sennacherib, Hezekiah's illness, and envoys from Babylon.

What comfort do we see in Isaiah 26:19?

From the context, what does the word Leviathan represent (Isaiah 27:1-11)?

Isaiah 27:12 tells us: "In that day the LORD will thresh." What does it mean that the Lord will thresh?

How is Ephraim described in Isaiah 28:1-3?

Isaiah 28:16 tells us: "See, I lay a stone in Zion, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone for a sure foundation." What is the significance of the cornerstone?

In Isaiah chapter 29 we have the name David's city, Ariel. Ariel is another name for Jerusalem. What is going to happen to Jerusalem?

What is the significance that Jerusalem will be like an altar hearth (Isaiah 29:2)?

In Isaiah 30:7, the Lord calls Egypt Rahab the Do-Nothing. What is Rahab?

Isaiah 30:33 tells us: “Topheth has long been prepared; it has been made ready for the king.” What is Topheth?

Isaiah 31:1 tells us: “Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help, who rely on horses.” Why weren’t the people, or kings, of Israel to rely on horses?

Isaiah 32:1 tells us: “See, a king will reign in righteousness.” What does it mean to reign in righteousness?

How are the women of Jerusalem described in Isaiah 32:9?

What is Isaiah 33:20-24 a reference to?

Isaiah 34:6 tells us: “The sword of the LORD is bathed in blood.” What is the sword of the Lord?

Who will be able to use the highway mentioned in Isaiah 35:8?

What did the Assyrians tell the men of Hezekiah (Isaiah 36:10)?

Why would Hezekiah tear his clothes (Isaiah 37:1)?

What mistake did Hezekiah do when the envoys from Babylon came (Isaiah 39:4)?
