WEEK 56

ISAIAH 40:1—52:15

In this week we have looked at comfort for God's people, the helper of Israel, the Servant of the Lord, a song of praise to the Lord, Israel is blind and deaf, Israel's only Savior, God's mercy and Israel's unfaithfulness, Israel the chosen, worship the Lord not idols, Jerusalem will be inhabited, the gods of Babylon, the fall of Babylon, Israel as being stubborn, Israel will be freed, the Servant of the Lord, the restoration of Israel, Israel's sins and the Servant's obedience, and everlasting salvation for Zion.

What prophecy do we see in Isaiah 40:3?

What image of Jesus do we see in Isaiah 40:11?

Who is the one from the east, as stated in Isaiah 41:2; and what does he do?

Isaiah 41:25 tells us: "He treads on the rulers as if they were mortar, as if he were a potter treading the clay." Why would a potter tread on clay?

Who is the servant that Isaiah writes about in Isaiah 42:1-4?

How is Israel like the blind and the deaf (Isaiah 42:20)?

Isaiah 43:24 tells us: "You have not...lavished on me the fat of your sacrifices." What was the significance of the fat in animal sacrifices?

Isaiah 44:2 tells us: "Do not be afraid, O Jacob, my servant, Jeshurun, whom I have chosen." What does Jeshurun mean?

Isaiah 44:28 and 45:1 both mention Cyrus. Why is Cyrus mentioned in these passages?

Isaiah 46:1 mentions Bel and Nebo. Who are they?

What will the sorcerers of Babylon be able to do to stop the coming destruction of Babylon (Isaiah 47:9-12)?

What does the Lord say concerning Israel, if they had remained faithful to Him (Isaiah 48:18-19)?

What are we reminded of in Isaiah 49:6?

Isaiah 49:16 tells us: “See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands.” What is the significance of engraving something on the palm of one’s hands?

Isaiah 51:17 tells us: “Awake, awake! Rise up, O Jerusalem, you who have drunk from the hand of the LORD the cup of his wrath, you who have drained to its dregs the goblet that makes men stagger.” What is the significance of draining the cup of wrath to its dregs?

What is Isaiah 52:10 a reference to?
