

TODAY'S LIGHT BIBLE STUDY

WEEK 58

JEREMIAH 3:1—14:22

In this week we have looked at unfaithful Israel, disaster from the north, that no one is upright in the land, Jerusalem under siege, that false religion is worthless, the valley of slaughter, sin and punishment, God and idols, the covenant is broken, the plot against Jeremiah, Jeremiah's complaint and God's answer, the linen belt, the wineskins, the threat of captivity, and the drought, famine, and sword.

How did Israel and Judah commit adultery (Jeremiah 3:9)?

Jeremiah 4:5 tells us: "Announce in Judah and proclaim in Jerusalem and say: 'Sound the trumpet throughout the land!'" Why were trumpets sounded throughout the land?

What has brought this invasion to the land (Jeremiah 4:18)?

How many upright and honest people need to be found in the city of Jerusalem for the Lord to forgive them? What will happen to the people (Jeremiah 5:1, 15)?

Jeremiah 6:9 tells us: "This is what the LORD Almighty says: 'Let them glean the remnant of Israel as thoroughly as a vine.'" Why did Jeremiah use the picture of someone "gleaning" from the "vines"?

What does God tell the people will happen to the Temple (Jeremiah 7:12-15)?

Jeremiah 7:18 tells us that women made cakes of bread for the Queen of Heaven. Who is the Queen of Heaven?

How have the people of Judah done evil in the eyes of the Lord (Jeremiah 7:30)?

What is meant in Jeremiah 8:8 when it says: “How can you say, ‘We are wise, for we have the law of the LORD,’ when actually the lying pen of the scribes has handled it falsely.”?

Jeremiah 9:17 tells us: “Call for the wailing women to come.” Who were the wailing women?

What does Jeremiah 9:25-26 tell us about the relationship between God and His chosen people?

What is going to happen to the false gods (Jeremiah 10:10-11)?

Jeremiah 11:3-4 tells us: “Cursed is the man who does not obey the terms of this covenant.” Why did Jeremiah want Judah to obey the terms of God’s covenant?

What is going to happen to the people who were plotting against Jeremiah (Jeremiah 11:21-23)?

Jeremiah 13:1 tells us that God told Jeremiah to buy a linen belt. What is a linen belt?

What is God’s response to the fact that there are prophets in the land that are saying that there will be no destruction (Jeremiah 14:13-15)?
