WEEK 73

ZECHARIAH 3:1—8:23

In this week we have looked at clean garments for the High Priest, the gold lampstand and the two olive trees, the flying scroll, the women in a basket, four chariots, a crown for Joshua, justice and mercy and not fasting, and the Lord promises to bless Jerusalem.

What do the filthy clothes represent in Zechariah 3:3-4?

Zechariah 3:9 tells us: "There were seven eyes on that one stone." What is this stone that the prophet talks about?

What will the Lord do on one single day (Zechariah 3:9)?

What does the gold lampstand represent in Zechariah chapter 4?

Zechariah 4:10b tells us: "These seven are the eyes of the LORD, which range throughout the earth." What does the seven eyes mean and what does it mean to range throughout the earth?

Zechariah 5:1-2 tells us that Zechariah sees a scroll flying. Why was the scroll flying?

What is the woman in the basket called by the angel (Zechariah 5:7)?

Where are the two women (angels) taking the basket (Zechariah 5:9-11)?

What is the meaning of the word “Babylonia” in Zechariah 5:11?

What does the angel say that the four chariots are (Zechariah 6:1-8)?

Zechariah 6:11 tells us: “Take the silver and gold and make a crown, and set it on the head of the high priest.” What was the significance of putting a crown on the head of the high priest?

Zechariah 7:5-6 talks about the Israelites fasting. Why did the Israelites fast during certain months and hold festivals in others?

Zechariah 8:6 talks about the remnant of Israel. What is the remnant of Israel?

Zechariah 8:23 tells us that, “ten men from all languages and nations will take firm hold of one Jew.” Who is this Jew that the text is talking about, and what are the ten men?
