

TODAY'S LIGHT BIBLE STUDY

WEEK 81

LUKE 17:1—JOHN 3:36

In this week we have looked at sin, faith, duty, ten healed of leprosy, the coming of the kingdom of God, the Parable of the Persistent Widow, the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, the little children and Jesus, the rich ruler, Jesus again predicts His death, a blind beggar receives his sight, Zacchaeus the tax collector, the Parable of the Ten Minas, the Triumphal Entry, Jesus at the Temple, the authority of Jesus questioned, the Parable of the Tenants, paying taxes to Caesar, the resurrection and marriage, whose Son is the Christ?, the widow's offering, signs of the end of the age, Judas agrees to betray Jesus, the Last Supper, Jesus on the Mount of Olives, Jesus arrested, Peter disowns Jesus, the guards mock Jesus, Jesus before Pilate and Herod, the crucifixion, Jesus' death, Jesus' burial, the resurrection, on the road to Emmaus, Jesus appears to the disciples, the ascension, the Word became flesh, John the Baptist denies being the Christ, Jesus the Lamb of God, Jesus' first disciples, Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael, Jesus changes water to wine, Jesus clears the temple, Jesus teaches Nicodemus, and John the Baptist's testimony about Jesus.

How many of the 10 lepers were healed, and how many of them came back to thank and praise Jesus (Luke 17:11-19)? When, during the Church year is this reading?

What is being discussed in Luke 17:34-36?

The Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Luke 18:9-14) has the Pharisee making disparaging remarks about the tax collector. Why were tax collectors despised?

Why would the disciples rebuke the people for bringing babies and children to Jesus (Luke 18:15), and what does that tell us about children in respect to Jesus?

What were the disciples to tell the owner of the colt when asked why they were taking it (Luke 19:31)? Did they have any problems getting it?

Why was Jesus so upset about people selling in the temple area (Luke 19:45-46)?

How does Jesus answer the spies question concerning paying taxes to Caesar (Luke 20:21-25)?

What is Jesus talking about when he tells his disciples: “As for what you see here, the time will come when not one stone will be left on another; every one of them will be thrown down.” (Luke 21:6)?

Where did Jesus and his disciples celebrate the Passover meal (Luke 22:10-12)?

What does Luke’s Gospel say came to Jesus to give him strength (Luke 22:43)?

Why did Judas kiss Jesus (Luke 22:47)?

Who was forced to help Jesus carry His cross (Luke 23:26)?

Luke 23:45 tells us that at the death of Jesus that the curtain of the temple was torn in two. What was the significance of the curtain in the temple tearing in two?

When do the two men realize that it is Jesus who is with them in the Emmaus account (Luke 24:30-31)?

John’s Gospel begins by saying, “In the beginning was the Word” (John 1:1). Who or what is the Word?

What was pointed out as the first miracle of Jesus (John 2:1-11)?

What is different with John’s account of Jesus clearing the temple (John 2:12-22)?

John 3:5 has Jesus telling Nicodemus, “I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit.” What does it mean to be born of water and the Spirit?
