JOHN 15:1—ACTS 2:47

In this week we have looked at the vine and the branches, the world hates the disciples, the work of the Holy Spirit, the disciples' grief will turn to joy, Jesus prays for Himself, Jesus prays for His disciples, Jesus prays for all believers, Jesus arrested, Jesus taken to Annas, Peter's first denial, the high priest questions Jesus, Peter's second and third denials, Jesus before Pilate, Jesus sentenced to be crucified, the crucifixion, the death of Jesus, the burial of Jesus, the empty tomb, Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene, Jesus appears to His disciples, Jesus appears to Thomas, Jesus and the Miraculous catch of fish, Jesus reinstates Peter, Jesus taken up into Heaven, Matthias chosen to replace Judas, the Holy Spirit comes at Pentecost, Peter addresses the crowd, and the fellowship of the believers.

What two parts of the arrest of Jesus is unique to the Gospel of John (John 18:6, 10)?

John 18:12-16 has Jesus being taken to Annas. Why did the Jewish officials bring Jesus to Annas before bringing him to Caiaphas?

What was the response of the chief priests when Pilate asked if he should crucify their king (John 19:15)?

What event, during the crucifixion of Jesus, is only mentioned in the Gospel of John (John 19:25:27)?

What happened when the soldier pierced Jesus' side with the spear (John 19:34)?

John 20:16 has Mary speaking Aramaic with the word "Rabboni." Why did Mary speak in Aramaic?

What does the end of John's Gospel say concerning who the author of the Gospel is (John 21:20-24)?

To whom is Acts written to and what does that tell us about who the author is (Acts 1:1)?

Acts 1:12-26 has the disciples casting lots to find a replacement for the spot vacated by Judas. Why did the believers choose an apostle by casting lots?

Acts 2:1-13 tells of the Holy Spirit coming on the day of Pentecost. What is the day of Pentecost?

What was Peter tell the crowd that the disciples are not and what is his reasoning (Acts 2:15)?

How many believers were added to the disciples number on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:41)?
