**As We Gather:** Please be respectful of those who are in the pews preparing their hearts and minds for worship.

***As you prepare for worship, you may pray the following prayer:***

O Lord, my creator, redeemer, and comforter; as I come to worship You in spirit and in truth, I humbly pray that You would open my heart to the preaching of Your Word so that I may repent of my sins, believe in Jesus Christ as my only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear me for the sake of His name. Amen.

**Luke 17:19** – “**And he said to him, ‘Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.’**” Only one of the 10 lepers who were cleansed returned to give thanks to Jesus. Why is that? Surely the rest were indeed thankful to be freed from such a terrible disease. But only the Samaritan leper had faith, and his faith turned into action, as all true faith does. Our generosity to God’s work in the Church is likewise our faith in action.

Jesus comes in mercy and, by His Word, heals you in body and soul. “*Go and show yourselves to the priests,*” for you are cleansed (Luke 17:14), and you are granted access to the Lord’s temple. It is “*at Jesus’ feet, giving him thanks*” (Luke 17:16), that you worship God, for Christ Jesus is your great High Priest; His body is the true temple. In Him, you “*find rest, each of you in the house of her husband*” (Ruth 1:9), for the Lord has “*visited his people and given them food*” (Ruth 1:6). The person of Jesus Christ lodges Himself in holy food — bread and wine for believers to eat and drink. You lodge where Jesus lodges; His Father is your God, His people are your people. Death cannot part you from Him because His death and resurrection are eternally yours through Holy Baptism. “*Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead*” (2 Tim. 2:8). As surely as death could not hold Him, so surely “*the word of God is not bound*” (2 Tim. 2:9). His Gospel is entrusted “*to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also*” (2 Tim. 2:2), so that you “*may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus*” (2 Tim. 2:10). Such is the confession of faith for all the saints, who believe, each and confess the one Lord and Savior — Jesus Christ.

# WINDSBACH BOYS CHOIR

Windsbacher Knabenchor

This highly-acclaimed German boys choir has performed with the Deutsche Symphonie-Orchester Berlin, the Bamberger Symphoniker, and the Freiburger Barockorchester. With numerous CD recordings, TV and radio broadcasts, and frequent invitations to important festivals, the choir maintains an outstanding position in the choral music scene. As a musical and cultural ambassador, the Windsbach Boys Choir travels regularly within Europe, as well as to Japan, North and South America, Israel, Australia, Taiwan, Singapore and the People's Republic of China.

With a focus on sacred repertoire, the choir covers *a cappella* works of all eras, as well as the great oratorios of J. S. Bach, Händel, Mozart, Mendelssohn and Brahms. Esteemed conductor Martin Lehmann carefully arranges the concert programs to include a wide range of works from local as well as German and international composers.

The travelling choir consists of 50 singers, ages 12-19, who live and board together with another 70 singing students at their school in Windsbach, Germany. Vocal training, instrumental instruction and a well-rounded education are the focus of the Windsbach boarding school.
