

uther's 95 Theses begins, "when our ■Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent' (Matt. 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." That doesn't sound very exciting. Luther encouraged people to renew their Baptism every day. Christians are to daily die to the old Adam, their sinful nature. In his Large Catechism, Luther observed that Baptism "is nothing else than putting to death the old Adam, and after that the resurrection of the new man, both of which must take place in us all our lives, so that a truly Christian life is nothing else than a daily Baptism, once begun and ever to be continued. For this must be practiced without ceasing, that we ever keep purging away whatever is of the old Adam, and that that which belongs to the new man come forth."

Dying to self in order to rise with Christ is the daily reality of faith. The focus is not on our dying or on our old Adam (sin). The focus is on the promise of resurrection in Jesus Christ.

- † He is our life.
- † He is our hope.
- † He is our joy.

Repentance is a turning away from self to Jesus.

- † In Him is life and light.
- † In Him is salvation and forgiveness.
- † In Him is eternal life.

Repent. You are His. Through Baptism.
And this is true every day.



Try these strategies on for size next month:

- N Now is the time to THANK the Lord for His presence and forgiveness.
- O Older adults are God's gifts to the younger as we share our faith, servanthood, and modeling of celebrating that the Lord is still in control.
- V VOTE for those people who you feel are promoting love, care and understanding to all people, and not just the privileged.
- E EXAMINE your prayer life and keep close to Him, knowing for sure that He is always close to you.
- M MODEL to the younger the gifts and experiences of the Older.
- B BE who you are by doing something each day for others to enable them to be who they are, in Christ!
- E ENABLE something good to happen today!
- R REJOICE You woke up this morning so evidently the Lord has ministry for you to do today!

So, YES, let's say YES to November by continuing to serve, celebrate, and seek out those who are only seeing and sensing NO in their lives!

Scouts are saving aluminum cans, bottles and other items to be recycled. Proceeds will be used to cripple children.


The sermon this morning: 'Jesus Walks on the Water.'
