Hymn Studies With Esther-October 2023

The Hymn: Thy Strong Word #578

The Author: Martin Franzmann (1907-1976)

Thy Strong Word is an example of an occasional hymn, written upon request of a specific event. Walter E Buszin found the tune "Ebenezer," and asked a Concordia Seminary colleague, Martin Franzmann, to write a text to the tune. He intended to take it to the seminary commencement in 1955. Franzmann elected to base the text on the seminary's motto, "Light from above." The result was first sung in a seminary chapel service in October 1954. At the time the hymn only had four verses.

At some point, Buszin observed that the hymn would not be long enough for a commencement processional. He also suggested to Franzmann that the hymn should also have a "cross focus." After that suggestion, the verse "From the Cross Thy wisdom shining" was added. In 1959, the final doxological verse was added. This hymn was sung as a processional hymn at Concordia Seminary commencement exercises every year from 1955 to 1997 and several times after. It was also used in a number of opening of the year services.

Light- the source of life, the enabler of vision, and a rich figure of speech found often in the Scriptures-serves as the primary image of the hymn. The word itself is used in all but one verse and in each refrain-like verse ending. In the doxological verse, all the images of light from the previous verses are mentioned: The Creator of the physical light that orders our lives; Christ, the light of the world and bringer of salvation; and the faith-creating light of the Holy Spirit that is reflected in our sanctified lives.

When are we singing this hymn? Thy Strong Word will be the recessional hymn on Reformation Day, a day of rich, beautiful hymnody.

It's in the Way that You Use It

Consider the humble baseball bat. It is a simple tool designed for a complex task. The batter needs a tool that can consistently deliver force to a small ball which may be thrown at over 100 miles per hour, but which might also come slanting across the plate as a slow curve. For a game like this, the founders of baseball had to redesign the old cricket bat, which is more of a flat paddle. The tool had to fit the job.

But even a specially-designed tool can be used for a different purpose. It turns out that some years ago in England, the home of cricket, baseball bats suddenly started selling like hotcakes. What were folks across the pond doing with all those baseball bats? Using them as clubs in riots!

A tool can be used, and it can be misused. It's all in the way that you use it.

The same is true with the things of God. The Second Commandment states that we should "not misuse the name of the Lord." In the Small Catechism, Luther goes on to tell us exactly what this misuse is, as well as the proper use:

"We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks." (SC I)

The Lord has given us His name: He has placed it upon us in Holy Baptism and He has invited us to pray to Him as our Father. In this sense, the Lord's name is something for us to use. We should not misuse it ... and we should not fail to use it. The Pharisees of old were so afraid of misusing the name of God that they decided to simply never say the name of God (YHWH, Jehovah) at all! This non-use is just as bad as misuse. The Lord gives His gifts for our use.

A Christian steward is one who is called to use all of God's gifts for His purposes. This includes things like the Name of God, the Sacraments and the Word, and it also includes things like our family and friends, our talents and skills, our money and resources. Everything that God has given to you, He has given to you so that you may be blessed to use it for His kingdom.

It's all in the way that you use it!

St. Paul never asked for anything for himself except that others pray for him. To the church at Rome, he wrote, "I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to join me in earnest prayer to God on my behalf, that I may be rescued from the unbelievers in Judea, and that my ministry to Jerusalem may be acceptable to the saints, so that by God's will I may come to you with joy and be refreshed in your company" (Romans 15:30-32, NRSV).

Encourage your pastor by assuring him or her of your prayers and love.


