For I, the LORD your God, hold your right hand; it is I who say to you, "Fear not, I am the one who helps you" (Isaiah 41:13).

Greetings and Thanksgiving to you, in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

These past months, we have been Stepping Out in Faith as a congregation. May our Lord help us, as we strive to reach our goal of 120. But as we work for that, we need to be reminded that we all have a job to do. This doesn't just rely on a few, but relies of each and every one of us.

- 6. Seeing your Social Media posts sharing our Congregation to others. (Don't forget about Thanksgiving Eve worship on November 22nd or the Sunday School Christmas Program on December 17th.)
- 7. Knowing that you are remembering St. Paul's leadership and our congregation in your prayers.

May this be a month of many Thanksgivings, as we give thanks to God for all that He has done for us. Knowing that He is guiding us by the hand. I'll see you in worship.

OFFERINGS


Our offerings will continue to be going to CROSS. During the month of November, we will be having a food drive for CROSS.

God has blessed Saint Paul's Lutheran Church for over 150 years with faithful members who love their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In the Church, as well as in our households, there are times that can be challenging. Saint Paul's is facing this right now. Hymn Studies With Esther- November 2023

*All information taken from Lutheran Service Book- Companion to the Hymns, published by Concordia Publishing House

The Hymn: Now Thank We All Our God (LSB 895)

The Author: Martin Rinckart 1586-1649

About the Author:

After studying at the University of Leipzig, Martin Rinckart was a pastor, as well as the archdeacon in his hometown of Eilenburg. Rinckart's pastoral service was during the Thirty Years War, after which a plague struck, taking eight thousand residents with it, including his wife, Christine. In the year of 1637, he officiated at over four thousand funerals. The plague was followed by a famine, in which Rinckart organized emergency assistance, purchasing food out of his own pocket. In 1639, Swedish Soldiers threatened Eilenburg, demanding a payment to keep the city safe. He organized residents in singing and praying in front of the soldiers, and the payment was lessened after the commander of the soldiers were touched by his devotion. Even through all of this, Martin Rinckart never lost his spirit. He wore a signet ring that was inscribed with the word MVSICA. He explained this word by abbreviating the sentence "Mein Vertrauen Steht In Christo Allein"- "My trust is in Christ alone."

About the Hymn:

This hymn is based on a passage from the apocryphal book of Ecclesiasticus. Luther's German translation of the beginning of this passage reads "Nun danket alle Gott, der grofe Dinge tut an allen Enden, der uns von Mutterleib" This was transferred nearly word for word into Rinckart's first stanza:

....

Now thank we all our God (line 1)

Who wonderous things hath done (line 3)

In Whom this world rejoices (line 4)

Who from our mother's arms (line 5)

The first stanza bids the congregation give thanks to God for His countless blessings that He shows to people from their birth to their dying days. Stanza 2 emphasizes that proper thanks is more than just words, because thanks to God is rightly spoken "with ever joyful hearts." The final stanza, is a paraphrase of the Gloria Patri, a doxology of the Holy Trinity.

When are we singing this hymn? This hymn will be sung on Thanksgiving Eve.

Give Thanks with a Grateful Heart!

Our Father in heaven has claimed us as His own. By the shedding of His Son's blood, by His death for our sins and His resurrection for our justification, God the Father has received us back into His family. By water combined with His Word, promise and name, the Holy Spirit has taken up residence in us. We belong to Father, Son and Holy Spirit. He is in us, and we are in Him. And being in Him, all things are ours. In Him, we are richly and abundantly blessed.

Our true treasure and wealth is that we belong to the most holy Trinity and everything that is His belongs also to us: righteousness, peace, eternal life. Even our temporal treasures are gifts from His fatherly, divine goodness and mercy.

We receive our treasures from Him, and thus, as good stewards of His varied grace, we manage them in such a way that they may be returned to Him. We bring them to Him, hallowed through prayers of thanksgiving and God's Holy Word, as a sacrifice. Thus all our possessions, as gifts from God, are also sacrifices to Him, from which we eat to nourish our bodies and share with our family, neighbors and fellow Christians, with the poor and even our enemies, as holy things given by our holy God. His temporal gifts are blessings to and for us, and bring blessing upon us even as they are pressed into His service for His kingdom and the souls that receive them.

Thus we place all that we have into God's hands. He never fails to remember us and pours out the fullness of His promises upon us. We give thanks for all that He has done, is doing and will continue to do. We give thanks by not taking for ourselves, but giving to all even as our heavenly Father has given to us.

As we prepare for Thanksgiving celebrations, may we all give thanks continually for all that we are and all that we have because of God's providential care. And may we be all the more diligent in bringing everything that we have received from God to Him, so that He may bless it and employ it for the good of all—even for us. For to the one who has, more will be given, and he will have an abundance.

LWML will begin collecting items needed for the Hospice and Newborn Kits for Global Health Ministries. Some people have already started bringing items! Items can be placed in the basket in the Narthex. The goal is to assemble kits in February.

One Hospice Kit contains these items:

- 1 regular-size bath towel (approx. 52" long), new or gently used
- 1 washcloth, new or gently used (not microfiber)
- 1 bath-size bar unscented soap, such as Dove Unscented for Sensitive Skin, in original packaging
- 1 toothbrush, in original, individual packaging
- 1 pick-style comb
- 1 nail clipper, Larger size preferred
- · 6 Band-Aids, rubber-banded together
- 1 jar or tube of pure petroleum jelly, such as Vaseline/Approx. 4 ounces, lid taped
- 1 pair heavy-duty household gloves/Kitchen type, size medium

For one Newborn Kit use new or gently used items

- 1 regular-size bath towel (approx. 52" long)
- 1 washcloth (not microfiber)
- 1 bath-size bar white Ivory soap, in original packaging
- · 1 newborn cotton t-shirt or "onesie"

Size 0-3, or newborn

- 1 newborn stocking hat/Small size, a newborn's head is about 14" circumference
- 1 baby receiving blanket (approx. 30" x 30")
 Cotton or light flannel, knit or crocheted
- 2 cloth diapers
- 2 diaper pins


