



Psalm

Psalm 89:1-5, 19-29; antiphon: v. 8

- P O LORD God of hosts, who is mighty as you are, O LORD, with your faithfulness all around you?
- I will sing of the steadfast love of the Lord, forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations.
- For I said, "Steadfast love will be built up forever; in the heavens you will establish your faithfulness."
- You have said, "I have made a covenant with my chosen one; I have sworn to David my servant:

- P 'I will establish your offspring forever, and build your throne for all generations."
- Let the heavens praise your wonders, O Lord, your faithfulness in the assembly of the holy ones!
- Of old you spoke in a vision to your godly one, and said: "I have granted help to one who is mighty; I have exalted one chosen from the people.
- I have found David, my servant; with my holy oil I have anointed him,
- **P** so that my hand shall be established with him; my arm also shall strengthen him.
- The enemy shall not outwit him; the wicked shall not humble him.
- **P** I will crush his foes before him and strike down those who hate him.
- My faithfulness and my steadfast love shall be with him, and in my name shall his horn be exalted.
- **P** I will set his hand on the sea and his right hand on the rivers.
- **C** He shall cry to me, 'You are my Father, my God, and the Rock of my salvation.'
- **P** And I will make him the firstborn, the highest of the kings of the earth.
- My steadfast love I will keep for him forever, and my covenant will stand firm for him.
- **P** I will establish his offspring forever and his throne as the days of the heavens.
- Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

2 Samuel 7:1–11, 16

¹Now when the king lived in his house and the LORD had given him rest from all his surrounding enemies, ²the king said to Nathan the prophet, "See now, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of God dwells in a tent." ³And Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that is in your heart, for the LORD is with you."

⁴But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan, ⁵"Go and tell my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD: Would you build me a house to dwell in? ⁶I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent for my dwelling. ⁷In all places where I have moved with all the people of Israel, did I speak a word with any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" ⁸Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. ⁹And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. ¹⁰And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may dwell in their own place

and be disturbed no more. And violent men shall afflict them no more, as formerly, ¹¹from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel. And I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house. . . .

¹⁶And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever."


Reading Luke 1:26–38

And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, ³³and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

- **©** But now in these last days, He has spoken to us by His Son.







- C Amen.


Lord's Prayer


