
Convention WRAP-UP

he 80th convention of the Minnesota South District is in the books. It was one of special note, certainly because of all the amazing people who attended, the outstanding festival choir and worship services, the Bible studies and essayist, and our incredible host, Concordia University, St. Paul (CSP). But even more so for how efficiently and quickly the convention delegates finished their work. They basked in the convention theme "...So That..." based on John 15:16-17, emphasizing how we have been chosen in Christ Jesus "so that" we may "go" and bear abiding fruit. This the delegates took to heart!

Scheduled to meet June 12-14, the delegates wrapped up all voting and resolution debate by Friday night and voted to amend their agenda and end early with closing worship on Friday night, June 13. That is the first I have heard or seen of such action! I believe it is a testament to the proficiency and preparedness of the delegates, but also to all the hard work of those who put together and enacted the convention. Thanks be to God!

Day 1 of the convention began and ended with the highlights of the day. It kicked off with numerous interest

centers to help orient delegates to their work, including a well-attended session on "How a District Convention Works." An inspiring close to the day was the opening worship service led by Rev. Chou Vang, who served as convention chaplain, and Dr. David Mennicke, our convention music and choir director. Dr. Mennicke put together a wonderful choir, a tremendous ensemble of brass musicians, and a delightful handbell choir to accompany the beautiful singing of the convention. LCMS President Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison shared with us the Good News of Christ crucified and raised from the dead.

The work of the convention took place on Day 2. Elections were held to fill the district's officers, board members, and the CSP Board of Regents, and resolutions were debated throughout the day. Some of the significant resolutions delegates adopted include two financial resolutions:

- 2-01 adjusts the percentages of giving to district and Synod, and;
- ➤ 2-02A encourages congregations to add a line item to their budgets to increase giving to the district.

There were also two significant resolutions regarding the governance of the

district (resolutions 4-01 and 4-02) — to update the governance model for the Minnesota South Board of Directors to fall in line with the practice of the Synod Board of Directors.

Our time together was not only work. A reception sponsored by CSP and Lutheran Church Extension Fund allowed for wonderful fellowship and networking in a new and well-received layout of the convention and vendor floor plan. Along the way, when there was a rare lull in the action, I was able to keep everyone's spirits lively with a bevy of dad jokes, complete with groaners and sighing.


Congratulations!

The LWML Minnesota South District disbursed \$23,580 to 12 Mission Grants, completely funding Bibles and Catechisms for Haitian students (#10). The 11 remaining Mission Grant recipients received \$990 to \$4,000. The next mite distribution will be in August.

Mission Grant Proposals

Now is the time to submit a Mission Grant application for the 2026-2028 biennium.

Who should consider applying for a Mission Grant? Individual LWML members, groups, zones, conferences or LCMS-affiliated organizations are welcome to submit a proposal.

As you prayerfully consider whether to apply on behalf of an organization, school, church, missionary or another entity, ask yourself if the following criteria can be met:

- Is it mission in emphasis, extending the ministry of God's Word? The Gospel must be the focus of any mission project we support.
- Does it fit into the plans and projections of the LCMS? Is there a Lutheran identity in the teachings, materials and work?
- Does it have a governing unit, such as a partner church, LCMS district, or Recognized Service Organization to which the ministry project regularly reports?
- Is it current and ready for implementation? Is the project able to sustain service to the people it serves following completion of the grant?

Here are several other things to consider:

- ► The Mission Grant application process is only the first step. Once all applications are received on or before Jan. 5, 2026, the Gospel Outreach Committee meets to prayerfully consider each application that meet the criteria. Input from our district and Synod mission leaders, our district pastoral counselors, District President Rev. Dr. Lucas Woodford, and District LWML President Lisa Kamrath help guide the process as well.
- ➤ Those applications that pass this first step will be placed on the ballot at the 31st Biennial LWML Minnesota South District Convention, to be held June 18-20, 2026. Voting delegates will select the Mission Grants to support, based on input from their groups and zones.
- ➤ Finally, those Mission Grants with the most votes, which fit within our approved Mission Grant goal (dollar amount) for the next biennium will be funded over the course of two years by our mite offerings.

You can obtain the application and instruction forms at *mnslwml.org*. Click the "Missions" tab, and then click "Mission Grant Proposal" to access both forms. The completed proposal must be sent by email or postal mail prior to the Jan. 5, 2026 postmark deadline.
