Fifth Reading Jesus recites the Words of Institution.

(The fourth candle is extinguished)

(The eighth candle is extinguished)

Eleventh Reading Jesus is put into the custody of Pontius Pilate.

(The ninth candle is extinguished)

Twelfth Reading Jesus is put on the stand before Pontius Pilate.

(The tenth candle is extinguished)

Thirteenth Reading The crowd shouts, "Crucify him, crucify him!"

Fourteenth Reading The Roman soldiers mock Jesus.

(The eleventh candle is extinguished)

Fifteenth Reading Jesus is crucified.

(The twelfth candle is extinguished)
