As We Gather

Prayer is a conversation with God, beginning with His Good News and followed by our response. John first identified Jesus as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29) and then the disciples asked where He was staying. Although first called to be a prophet, Isaiah thought his warning had been in vain. But God raised his sight to see in Israel a light for the whole world. And when the faithful people in Corinth seemed plagued with problems, Paul reminded them that they lacked no spiritual gift as they awaited our Lord's return. Today is a day to hear the Gospel and respond not in our own strength, but out of confidence in what God has already said to us, through prophets and apostles, in print and, of course, in the person of His Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

We Celebrate Holy Communion Today

In this Supper of our Lord, we receive the true body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ, in with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sins. Since this is also a sign of our common confession of faith, we welcome to the Lord's Supper all those who are confirmed members of congregations of the Lutheran-Church Missouri Synod, all others are asked to please talk to Pastor. *Non-alcohol wine is included in the center of each tray for those with special needs.*

³⁵The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples, ³⁶and he looked at Jesus as he walked by and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God!” ³⁷The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. ³⁸Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them, “What are you seeking?” And they said to him, “Rabbi” (which means Teacher), “where are you staying?” ³⁹He said to them, “Come and you will see.” So they came and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day, for it was about the tenth hour. ⁴⁰One of the two who heard John speak and followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. ⁴¹He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which means Christ). ⁴²He brought him to Jesus.






