From the Pastor's Desk . . .

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ,

2019 saw some great spiritual growth in our congregation. We are seeing more people regularly in God's Word through Bible study and worship attendance. We are seeing more people in prayer. People are giving to the work of the Lord. There is an increased level of joy within our congregation. Guess who hates this? If you said, "Satan", you would be correct. Satan hates what is going on here at St Peter and he is going to do everything he can to hinder and destroy it. Because of this, I believe it is important we take the month of March to do a sermon series on spiritual warfare. We need to be aware and ready for the attacks that come in our personal lives and in the life of the church. Here is an overview of our next series:

March 1 – An Introduction to
Spiritual Warfare – This session will
give an overview of who the devil is
and an overview of the spiritual
battle that we face in our lives as
Christians. It will serve as the
foundation of this series.

March 8 – Belt & Breastplate – We will dive into the different pieces of

the armor that God has given to us and we read about in Ephesians 6. We will start with the belt of truth and the breastplate of righteousness. We will discuss how these two pieces are so vital and important as we deal with the schemes of the devil.

March 15 – Shoes & Shield – We will look at the shoes that our feet are fitted with the readiness that comes from the Gospel. It is important to be ready and prepared for battle and we have the greatest message in the world, the Gospel. We also take up the shield of faith, to extinguish the flaming arrows of Satan. God is calling us to greater faith, when Satan wants us to cower in fear and guilt and shame. We must hold out that shield of faith to block the attacks.

March 22 – Helmet & Sword – The final two pieces are the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit. The helmet focuses on the hope (assurance) that we have of our salvation in Jesus Christ. We rest in that assurance when Satan wants us to doubt it. The sword, Paul says, is the Word of God. It is the piece that we can attack and fight back with. We respond to Satan's attacks with the truths we find in the Bible. We have to know God's Word to respond properly.

March 29 – How Jesus Responded to Attacks – We will look at two

particular instances in Jesus' life when He was attacked and see how He responded. We will look at Jesus' temptation in the wilderness in Matthew 4 and we will look at Jesus' struggle in the Garden of Gethsemane. Both of these stories have a lot to say to us as we faces the attacks of Satan in our lives.

In this whole series, we want to never forget that the victory has already been won by Jesus through His death and resurrection. While we face attacks, we know the end of the story. Jesus wins and through Him, we win also. I pray that this series will be an encouragement to you and a blessing to our congregation.

He mentioned that last year's release of non-local inactive members reduced the total number of members. One new family has transferred in and another family is in the process of transferring in. The Elders are discussing the future of the partnership with Faith in Hebron as the agreement expires at the end of 2020. Faith has been very happy with the partnership. The sermon series on Romans 12 will continue thru February.


















DLS 1st & 2nd Grade

LCMS Stewardship Ministry

We are at the beginning of Lent. During the Lenten season, the church calls to our attention the sufficiency of what God gives. It points to the sufficiency of God's grace in the atoning work of Jesus. It

shows us the sufficiency of faith in Jesus' work for us. It makes known the sufficiency of God's Word in faith and life.

But Lent doesn't just remind us of the sufficiency of God's spiritual gifts, the gifts that pertain to our redemption and salvation. Lent also reminds us of the sufficiency of the physical, temporal gifts of God, those that pertain to this body and life. In other words, it reminds us of the importance of godly contentment and of outward discipline and training of the body.

This outward training of the body teaches us not to give in to every desire of our flesh but to learn to say no to them. And it does this in such a way that if you fail, it is no sin. It is a way to practice without putting yourself into a compromising situation.

The easiest example of this is fasting. When you fast, you are practicing saying no to the desires of your body. But if you fail in this, if you break your fast, you have not sinned. You have, though, learned something about how your flesh works, how difficult it is to fight against it, and how you need help from above in order to do it.

There is another example of this. It is alms-giving. This is an increase in giving to the church and its mission during this time. We all know that our flesh finds security in money and stuff. By committing to give more to the church, you are training your flesh. You are, by this outward discipline, training yourself to be content with what God gives. You are practicing saying "no" to your desires. Again, if you fail, you have not sinned. But you've learned just how powerful your flesh is in leading you instead of you leading it. You've learned how you need help from above in being content with what God gives.
