Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

What is the best gift you have ever received? What is the most memorable gift you have received? As we draw closer to Christmas, our minds can get focused on going to the stores and getting gifts for people. Some of you have already started your Christmas shopping. Some of you wait until the weekend before to get your shopping done. Whenever you do your shopping, this is definitely the season of gifts.

As we think about giving gifts this Christmas, I want to take a moment and think about three different people in your life that you could give a gift to this Advent and Christmas time:

(1) Your kids/family - I know that you will get very busy trying to get all those different gifts for your kids and grandkids. Whether it is clothes, video games or movies, or something else, it is going to be a

busy time. In the midst of gifts that you give, don't forget about the spiritual side of things as well. Maybe, you can give the gift of a Bible Story book. Maybe it is a cross to remind them of what Jesus for them. Another great gift is to be an example of serving in God's church and helping others out. I remember in the past, Dave and Diane Beikmann would bring their girls with them for caroling. What a great legacy to have for the next generation. #### **Opening**

The regular meeting of the Deshler Lutheran School Board was called to order at 8:00 p.m. on August 18, 2014.

#### **Present**

Pastor Brian Francik, Pastor B.J. Fouts, Dan Deardoff, Galen Sasse, Darin Jalas, Dale Endorf, Allen Werner, Tyler Harms, Mike Holtzen, Russ Reinke, Lynn Bohling, Karla Deepe. Visitors: Ralph Simon

#### **Visitor Input**

Ralph Simon with the LCMS Foundation addressed the group with ideas and suggestions for the endowment fund. Ralph recommended that the appointed committee review quarterly statements and that they also give an annual report to the board with regard to the funds.

#### **Approval of Agenda**

The agenda was approved as presented.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

June and July minutes were approved as presented.

#### **Approval of Treasurer Report**

Balance of the Needs Fund is \$8,831.00. Balance of the General Fund is \$13,542.00. Moving expenses have been taken care of and direct deposit transactions are now in place, as are the Concordia plans for new faculty. Housing allowances were discussed. Dan presented amounts for himself, Christina and Kara based on estimated expenses. A motion was made by Darin, second by Mike to approve the above. Motion carried. A motion was then made by Mike,

second by Galen to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

#### **Trustees**

Blinds have been installed in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade room. Ceiling fan, gasket and cabinet have been installed, the faucet is yet to be repaired. Galen reported that it may be necessary to replace this faucet. It was noted that an appliance in the kitchen has been making a squealing noise. Galen will investigate. Dan would like to have a bracket installed for a projector in the Kindergarten room. The projector has already been purchased. The group agreed that Dan should proceed to locate and purchase the needed bracket applying the expense to Technology. Dan also reported that the whiteboard in the Kindergarten room needs some attention and possible repair.

Nothing to report at this time.

#### **Church Council & Pastors**

No report at this time.

#### Administration

Hot Lunch Balance: \$4,110.60. 49 students are enrolled for the 2014-2015 school year at DLS. All day Kindergarten seems to be appreciated. There has been a request for the student body roster to be sent to both congregations prior to the Association Meeting in November. It was determined that one copy should also be posted in the Narthex of both churches. The Care and Share school newsletter is emailed each Thursday.

#### **Old Business**

Internet: Currently only two classrooms are using the Internet daily. As other classrooms will join in the shared usage an upgrade in internet service speed/capacity may be necessary. Dan will investigate a possible grant for this improvement and the parameters of the offer.

Fund Committee: Mike moved for the Board to form a committee to establish endowment documents and regulations; to supervise and report annually on the fund by the October DLS Board meeting and ultimately to promote fund growth. Motion carried. Committee members will be appointed and sample documents will be reviewed at the September 15 meeting. The committee will be asked to report back to the board at the October Board meeting. Website: The school website is nearly finalized and linking back to Facebook. A fee of \$15 per month will serve to promote the site higher in Google services. Dan will pursue this through Public Relations.

The agenda was approved as presented.

Minutes of the August 18, 2014 meeting were approved as amended. The amendment was to the last sentence in the trustee's paragraph, regarding the white board which was actually placed in the kindergarten room.

#### **Trustees**

Galen reported on the following items which need fixed or looked in to.

- -kitchen fridge still squeals
- -sink at the south end
- -sidewalk repair-there will be no help from the city on this
  - -sprinkler system needs drained
- Galen will talk to Harvey.

#### **Treasurer**

Lynn reported a checking account balance of \$9,299.99 and a needs account balance of \$2,432.39. \$6000 was transferred from needs to general account checking to cover an overdraft. St. Peter is \$1000 behind for their August payment and Trinity is current thru August. The August P&L statement from Linda Cox was also presented showing our status with payments from both churches current thru July.

A \$500 gift was received from the Mundt Foundation. It was agreed to place this in the needs account. A \$122 gift from the Maurine Wassom memorial will be placed in the general fund.

There was a motion by Tyler and a second by Galen to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

#### **Pastors and Council**

Pastor Brian stated there was nothing to report.

#### Administration

Dan reported the hot lunch balance is \$1023. Standard testing took

place last week. The I-Pads are working well. There are 50 of them on hand. The internet service is okay for now. Chapel offerings are going to LCMS Relief Fund. Flu vaccines are scheduled for October 29 at no cost to students. but with a cost to teachers and parents. Health screenings will be taking place. The current \$400 EPI pens are outdated as they expire every 12 months. New school shirts will be coming from Victory Too. Several conferences were discussed with locations at Milford, Omaha, and Grand Island. Travel reimbursement was discussed at the current IRS rate of \$0.545 per mile.

#### **Old Business**

There was no old business.

#### **New Business**

Information regarding teachers' pay for the Concordia Health plan needs to be in by October 1.
Allen reported on the forming of the Foundation Committee.
There was a motion by Mike and a second by Allen to adjourn.
Motion carried.

# ARTICLE V. OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS

#### Section 1

The officers of this organization shall be: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Christian Life and Historian/Public Relations.

#### Section 2.

The officers shall be elected by ballot at the November meeting. A majority of votes cast shall constitute an election. Officers shall begin their duties at the January meeting.

- a. A Vice President shall be elected every year and shall serve a term of one year. She shall then serve as President for one year.
- b. A Secretary shall be elected in odd numbered years and serve one term of two years
- c. A Treasurer shall be elected in even numbered years and serve one term of two years.
- d. A Christian Life Director shall be elected every year and shall serve a term of one year.
- e. A Historian /Public Relations Director shall be elected in even numbered years and shall serve one term of two years.

#### Section 5.

The Christian Life Director shall

- a. Encourage active participation in spiritual development programs for the society;
- b. Serve as the planning committee for the programs and devotional times for each meeting;
- c. Cooperate with Zone, District and LWML Christian Life Committees in furthering Bible study, topic discussions, workshops and retreats.
- d. Provide ideas, techniques and resources that will enrich and stimulate individuals to increase membership with the society.
- e. Distribute meeting notices.

Election of officers was held.

Nominations were presented –
Lois for Vice President, Barb for
Treasurer, Anita for Christian Life
Director, and Colleen for
Historian/Public Relations. Lori
made a motion to accept the ballot
as stated, Colleen seconded the
motion and the motion passed.
